In the Name of God Amen
 I Thomas Woolsey of the County of Green
 And State Tennessee former being sick
 and very weak but in perfect mind
 and memory Thanks be given unto God
 baling unto mind the Mortality of
 my body and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to Die I do make an
 ordain this my Last will and testament
 that is to say freely and first of
 all I give and Recommend my Soul into
 the hand of the almighty God that gave
 it and my body to the Earth to be buried
 in desant Christian burial at the
 Discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting
 but at the general Resurrection I
 shall receive the same again by the
 mighty power of God and as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it ~~pleased~~
 pleased God to bless me within this
 Life I give Devise and Dispose of the
 same in the following Manner and
 form first of all my Still and vessels
 and my gun to be sold at private sale
 by my Executors to discharge my Lawful debts
 and to purchase a Cow for the use of
 my family and the Remainder to be
 put to such uses my family may stand
 in need of and if they do not stand
 in need of it it is to be put to interest till
 wanted

Secondly my wife Phebe Woolsey is to
 Remain on this plantation as long as
 she remains my widow and she is to

have all the profits thereof to give (name)
the children and give them schooling
if that not sufficient the Executors
must provide for them out of the
Movable Estate

Thirdly all my farmers utensils is to
Remain with her on the plantation with
all my Stock and household furniture
untill my Daughter Phebe Woolsey is of
age then this plantation to be sold by
my Executors at publick or private sale
with all the movable Estate and the
hole of that part of my Estate to be divided
in equal shares between Phebe my wife and
Puteh Sarah Gilbert Mary Ann and Phebe
my children and forthly I do give unto
my Son Gilbert one hundred acres of
Land Lying and being on Little Lick
Creek between Nathaniel Curtis and Joseph
Cumstock Likewise LaPoint Biter
Parman and Arthurs Wall and Phebe
Woolsey my Sole Executors to my Estate
I Deputed Ratifying and Confirming this
and no other to be last will and
testament in witness whereof I
Hereunto set my Hand and Seal this
Sixt. Day of April in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and
Ninety seven

bequeath to my Son Richard M. Wood all
my proper interest in a Negro man
named Cyprus (viz) one third part, which
fell to me by a Settlement with my
Sons-in-law Frederick Otto, which I
have not given nor conveyed to any
person but my son, God gave me my
existence and to him I now commend
my soul, and my body to the dust
from whence it came amen.
