and ordain this my Last will and
Testament that is to say Principally

my soul into the hands of that gave it
and my body I recommend to the dust
to be buried in a Christian like
and decent manner at the discretion
of my Executor Nothing doubting but
at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God and as touching such
orally Exposed Interests I have
granted God to bless me in this

Life, I give devise and dispose of
 the same in the following manner
 and form.
 First I give and bequeath unto Ruth
 my wife the sum of five shilling
 this and I lived out of my Estate.
 Also I give and bequeath unto my well
 beloved Daughter Mary Clemens all and
 singular my Land messuages and tenements
 house and goods and movables to-
 gether with all money in hand or in
 debt or the sale of all that
 appertains unto me and all to be
 paid except a certain mare that is
 in due me and a cow an year
 old calf due from Joshua Lick to
 be reserved in the self same property
 for my daughter and so wholly disallow
 revoke and disown all and every
 other former testament wills legacies
 bequests or execution appointing my trusty
 friend Phadrock Menden the sole
 Executor I ever in witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and
 seal the day and year above written.
