First and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it. my body I commit to the earth to be buried in Christian decent manner at the discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall the same thro the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate where-with it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with in this transitory life. I give bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner. First I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Hennes Hawkins one small spinning wheel Bed and bedding, one chock bed. Six chairs. Three pots. Kettles &c. two chests one large and small one, one table, one pair of fire logs. Shovel and tongs, one Note of hand against John Newman for sundries therein mentioned one cow and calf, ten bushels of wheat aporly and every year as long as she remaine my widow with one hundred lbs of Pack. Six pounds of buckled flax. four pounds of wool

with a room and fire place for her own use during her natural life or so long as she remains my widow, my will and meaning is that the above household furniture as mentioned above include all that I got with her when I married her to be delivered unto her by my Executors after my decease and to remain her right and property as long as she remains my widow. I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Mary Callahan the sum of eighty four cents. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Isabella Martin the sum of eighty four cents. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Euphany Keely the sum of eighty four cents. I likewise give and bequeath unto my daughter Jenny Hankins eighty four cents to be paid unto my said daughters as above mentioned by my Executors twelve months after my decease. I likewise give bequeath and bestow unto my two sons William and John E. Hankins their heirs and assigns forever, the tract and parcel of land that I now live on containing two hundred acres be the same more or less together with all buildings and with another tract or parcel of land containing fifty acres be the same more or less that I purchased of Joshua Tidwell and joining the lands of sd Tidwell John Ross and John Hardin to be equally divided among my two sons above mentioned, with two horses. I give and bequeath unto my three

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Laughton, Peggy, Pally and Betsey Haukins
 all & singular my own manable property
 to be equally divided amongst them at the
 discretion of my Executors. I likewise
 constituted, ordain & appoint William
 Haukins, John E. Haukins and Joshua
 Tidwell, Executors of this my last will
 and testament & so forth, hereby revoking
 & disannulling all & every other will
 or wills, Testament or Testaments, Executor
 or Executors by me made or lawfully
 appointed or appointed in any other instrument
 or instrument of writing concerning my
 real & personal estate in whatever
 manner disposed off, testifying & hereby
 confirming this & no other to be my
 last will & Testament, in testimony
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & affixed my seal this the twenty
 third day of October in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred & eleven
