Supremis I give and bequeath my precious and immortal soul to God who gave it and as to what worldly Estate God has been pleased to bless me with my will and meaning is that it be so ordered and disposed of as by this my will and Testament is here after mentioned all my just debts and funeral expenses being first paid.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Henry Testerson all my Land & improvements whereon I now live containing eighty acres it being the same more or less so long as he may live there on, but in case he leaves the land and does not live there on my will and desire is that my son John Testerson shall have it to dispose of as he may think proper.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Nancy Testerson the daughter of William Testerson fifteen dollars to be paid out of moneys
