health but of sound mind & memory
& bearing in mind that I must shortly
be called hence and wishing as far as
possible to settle my worldly business &
dispose of my property do make this
my last will & Testament in manner
following after my death I wish my
body to be buried in a decent manner
2^{ndly} I give and bequeath unto my son
Samuel McCamish that part of a tract of
land granted to me by the State of
North Carolina for two hundred acres
on which I now live which lies north
of the line, lying at a stake in a
line of a piece of land, I sold to
Wm. Ross then with a dividing line
with my son George South fifty
acres east to a white oak at a
fence then north twenty then E to a
stake in the Spring branch then a
direct line to the place where a line
run from me divide a tract of

land I bought from Robt Rankin in two equal parts. I also give him the Northern half of the said tract, (say fifty acres) I also give my said son Samuel nineteen acres of land I bought of James Galloway joining James Galloway & Thos McCamish and my old tract & to my son George McCamish I give and bequeath that part of my old tract that lies South of a line run for David & fort South fifty seven East to a white oak then South twenty three, west twenty four poles to a stake then South sixty five East to David Rankin's line and joining the land of Debburn, Isaac, David, Hart and William Ross, Junior and for the love and good will I have for my Grandson William McCamish son of James McCamish I give and bequeath a part of my old tract beginning at a stake corner of George's fort already described then with his and Samuel's line North twenty three East to a stake in the pine branch then a direct line to a point from which a line will divide a hundred acres I bought of Robert Rankin in two equal parts then with the old line to George's line then with said line North sixty five West to the beginning, also I give to my Grandson the South half of the undivided tract that I bought from said Rankin and to my other children that is John McCamish, Isaac McCamish, Adam McCamish, Robert McCamish, Thomas McCamish, William McCamish, Betsey McPherson, Jennie McPherson, Peggy Hope and Percy Ross I give the sum of one dollar each to be made out of my personal property after the death of my self & my wife having
