most money. Col. R.L. Butler is authorized
as my agent to make out and collect
claims due me from the U.S. Government
for my services as Captain. Major &c.
reference is made to Gen Schofield,
Col. Hooker and other officers of the
Department of the Ohio as to my efficiency
and devotion to the cause of our common
Country my wife should collect of Col
Butler the amount due and son Oliver
as soon as collected by Col. Butler from
the U.S. Government. further I ordain that
my wife Janetta act as my Executrix without
being required to give bond for letters
of administration and that all my just
debts be paid as soon as practicable
