My dear Gerg

In The Name Of God Amen
 I Gerg of The County of Greene and
 State of Tennessee am very Sick of my
 body but of a perfect mind and memory
 Thanks unto God for the same but
 calling to mind the mortality of man kind
 that it is appointed for all men once
 to die I therefore make constitute and ordain
 this to be my last will and Testament
 in the manner and form following to wit
 in Girms I give and Recommend and
 my soul into the Hand of Almighty God
 and my body I recommend to be buried
 in a christian like manner and my
 worldly estate where with it hath pleased
 the Almighty God to bless me with in
 this world I give devise and dispose
 in the manner and form following
 Firstly I give and bequeath unto my
 dear beloved wife Catarina during her
 life time and the time of her widow
 hood twelve bushels of Rye three
 bushels of wheat, twenty bushel of
 Corn one hundred pound of pork
 with all the fat one half of a
 bushel of salt one Quarter of an
 acre of flax she shall have the
 choice to take it on which end
 she choose it. to take it one pair
 of New shoes and the mending and
 half dole as much as is necessary
 for her one cow and the food for
 the cow & one acre of meadow. but
 my son here after mentioned is to
 mow and make it and to haul it
 home for her in the stable and
 further one gallon of whiskey

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and one barrel for pounds of ^{good} wool
 six bushel of potatoes the half of the
 garden and of the patches as much as
 she want for her own use and she
 shall have the privilege of the new
 dwelling house the lower or upper
 room which she shall choose the best
 and the half of the Spring house and
 further they Executive hereafter mentioned
 shall provide for her that all the
 yarn which shall be spun of the
 flax of her quarter shall be weaved.
 one small iron pot, one crason, one
 Dish, three plates, three knives, three
 forks and three spoons further one
 mare and her saddle and bridle as
 long as the mare shall live and
 perhaps the mare should die then
 they shall provide for her one
 horse creature to ride. and my son
 hereafter mentioned shall feed the
 creature as well as his own
 and may use it except my wife
 Catharine should want it for her
 own use, further her bed, her
 spinning wheel, one chest further
 it is my will and desire that
 all the fore said articles shall
 be given to her yearly as long
 as she live or remains my widow
 further I will and bequeath unto
 my two sons John Gerg and William
 Gerg my plantation which contains
 two hundred and eighteen acres shall
 be equally divided amongst them
 the old plantation where the new
 house is on and all the buildings
 I give and devise to my son John
 Gerg, my son John Gerg is to pay

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yearly twenty five pounds in good trade
until he has paid the amount of two
hundred pounds and the other tract I
give and devise unto my son William
but my son John farm and tend
the other tract as long until my
son William arrives until his lawful
age my son William has to pay
after he arrives to his age one
hundred pounds that is to say in
five years yearly twenty pounds
in good trade but the last
payment shall be kept in his hands
if my wife Catharine should want it
but if she should want it after her decease
it shall fall back to my son William
further it is my desire that the two
horses creatures and gear, waggon
and plough, harrow and all the farmer
tools shall be with the land and
my sons John and William shall make
use of it. My son John shall give to
my son William after he arrives his
age the one mare and gear, one
steer. Further I give unto my two
sons three head of cows my son
William is to have one and my
son John two, further I give to my
sons John and William four sheep
and further it is my desire that
all the rest of my ^{moveable} estate here is
not mentioned shall be kept to pay
of the costs for the house and then
to be finished and after the house and
barn are finished the remainder of my
moveable shall be ~~equally~~ divided
as likewise the two hundred and
eighty pounds amongst seven children
namely Margaret the wife of John

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Enoch Elizabeth the wife of Emanuel
 Chairman Potaruna the wife of Joseph Teller
 Julianne Grog, Dolane Grog, Eena Grog,
 Michael Grog it is further my desire
 that after my wife Potaruna has decessed
 her bed, and her other shall be
 given to my daughter Eena Grog and
 it is further my desire that all the
 calfs of the cows which is bequeathed
 to my wife shall fall to my two
 sons John & William Grog and further
 the cow shall die then they must
 give to her another good cow, but
 they must take the calf of from the
 cow at four weeks old, it is
 my desire that my son Michael Grog
 shall raise him self a coat from
 the mare which I gave my wife
 and my two sons John and William
 shall feed the creature until he arrives
 his lawful age and it is further
 my will and desire to appoint and
 constitute to my two trusty friends
 Bazar Hooq Martin Linty Executors
 of this my last will and testament and
 I therefore renounce and for sake all
 other wills and testament and this
 my last will and testament in testimony
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this nineteenth day of February
 A.D. 1804
