Be it known and witnessed that I Ezrael D. Morris of Hardeman County in the state of Tennessee do make this my last will and testament.

It is my will that my personal estate shall be administered by three men selected and appointed by the County Court, and retained together under the special care and superintendance of my Executrix hereafter to be mentioned named for the comfortable maintenance of my relish and four Children, and educating the Children in such manner as they may think most consistent with their talents and future prospects. If my relish survives my daughter Eugenia attains the age of twenty, or thereunto with the consent of my executors, then and in that case a division of my personal property shall be made by my Executrix according to my relish one fifth part thereof, together with my mansion house and the land of three hundred and twenty five acres, or thereabouts on which it stands, for and during the term of her natural life.

Further it is my will that in the marriage of my relish (if such an event take place) or of any other circumstances in the opinion of my executors renders it proper for the benefit of the children, my appointed the County Court and have Guardians appointed to care of those who may be minors, the females under twenty and the males under twenty one years, and any of them attaining a majority or marrying with the consent of my Executrix, to have in their share a share by a fifth of all my personal property as appraised and increased shall accrue to him or her.



together on my tract of land, on the waters of Wolf

Item 5th My Will is that two small tracts of land,
one containing sixty eight acres, and the other seven and

Barnett and myself the price of said land is to be divided agreeably to an act or law held by brother John Barnett what is coming to my heirs of the price of said land when sold I wish laid out for the benefit of my heirs at the discretion of my executors.

Item 10th My Will is that a Black woman (whom I bought of Robert Spear and his bill of sale is in my name) by the name of Mary, that she and her increase be given to my sister Isabella Biles and her heirs for their benefit.

Item 11th My Will is that none of my servants (Mr. Gilbert and his wife Aggy and their children, which they now have or may have), Mrs. Aaron and Randall be sold out of my family unless it be their choice but divided among the heirs by my executors.

Item 12th My Will and desire is that for and in consideration of the love I have for, and the interest I feel in the well being of my stepson Alfred M. Shelly that when my executors collect and have money or hands that they give

the above named Alfred M. Shelly the sum of Three hundred Dollars at such time and in such a manner as to leave to him for his personal benefit the above sum of three hundred dollars.

Item 13th My Will and desire is that my old friend Joseph Lynn, my dear wife Betty Barnett Robert W. Barnett and Samuel Lambert except this my last will and testament. And that my brother John Barnett be clothed with all the power of an Executor in the distribution of my property among my children
