to my two sons John Brown Montgomery and Wiley
Montgomery all my landed Estate in the State and
County aforesaid to be equally divided between
them according to quality and quantity. Also
I desire that a sufficiency of my stock should
be sold to satisfy my debts and funeral expenses
and the balance to remain in common for the use
of the Family. Also I desire that when the
aforesaid Negro Woman and girl shall be sold
my son John B. Montgomery should have one hundred
Dollars of the price of said Negro and the balance to
be equally divided among my three girls Jane
Allen, Elizabeth Ann, & Mary Montgomery. I also
desire that my daughter Mary when she get married
to have a bed and beds & furniture equal to my

I leave to my beloved wife Jacky Blount during her natural life my plantation called Three Brooks containing four hundred eighty four acres with the stocks and farming utensils hereto belonging and Lot No. 115 in the Town of Warrenton with its improvements and I also leave to her during her widowhood all the rest of my Negroes, but as soon as she marries or dies, in case she dies before she marries the possession of these Negroes shall pass from her to be divided by my Executors hereafter named among each of the children of my Brother John Blount and after her death my Executors are to sell the land or they are chiefly interested to do altogether as a family or they shall think best and divide among the children as much as equally share & share alike the nett proceeds of the Sale.
