Lacy, until my youngest son John P. Lacy arrives at the age of twenty one year at which time one fifth of said Negroes shall be divided and apportioned to my said wife by Commissioners appointed by the Circuit Court of Hardeman County and as my four children arrive to the age of maturity or twenty one years they shall have their portion of said Negroes apportioned them by Commissioners appointed by the Court as above named to wit

To my Daughter named Margaret Lacy one fifth of the above mentioned Negroes valued by Commissioners appointed by the Court as above stated when she arrives at the age of twenty one year.

I will To my son Philip Dunstons Lacy one fifth part of said Negroes to be valued as above when he arrives at the age of twenty one year.

I will & bequeath to my son Beverly McLeod Lacy his portion of one fifth part of said Negroes shall be divided to him by Commissioners appointed by said Circuit Court when he shall have arrived at the age of twenty one years and also

I will and bequeath that my youngest son John P. Lacy shall have his portion of said Negroes seven Negroes and their names divided to him by Commissioners appointed as above to wit one fifth part as he shall have arrived at the age of twenty one year so that said

of my four children and my beloved wife may ultimately have and possess and equal share of said Negroes and their increase and when my youngest son John P. Lacy shall have arrived at the age of twenty one year my beloved wife is to have her portion of one fifth of said Negroes subject to her own disposal but not before that time but to be kept and used until that period for the general use and benefit of the family and not sold or disposed of in any other manner whatever except where the Negroes in the hands of the County I also will and bequeath that all the Horses Cattle Hogs and Swine of every description raised on my farm and also all my household and kitchen Furniture shall remain with and be at the disposal of my beloved wife for the support of the family and the education of the children should it become necessary to defray the expenses of my family or educate my children I will that an Order or Decree of Courts be procured for the sale of the Plantation on which I now live said Court appointing Commissioners to sell said land giving one month's Public Notice in some Newspaper printed in Town of Bolivar of the time and place of sale it is my wish that the said land and appurtenances if sold shall be disposed of for the highest bidder for cash at one and two years credit one half at each payment and that Bond and approved security shall be given by the Purchaser and that the title shall be recorded until the last payment is made the above trustee containing Contains seventy two Acres more or less.

I also will that my plantation three hundred Acres (long) on the waters of Short Creek one hundred fifty Acres of which tract of land is located the other half or one hundred fifty Acres is an adjoining one Occupant when my youngest son arrives at the age of twenty one year be sold by Commissioners to be appointed by the Court giving due notice of the time and place of sale in some Newspaper printed in Bolivar on the following terms one third cash in hand one third in twelve months and the remaining third in two years from the time of sale the purchaser giving Bond approved Security and the title to said land record until the last payment is made at which time and equal division of the proceeds of said land shall be made by said Commissioners to my beloved wife and my four children giving to each one fifth so that my wife may then dispose of her part as she may see fit also I will that my two lots and appurtenances in the Town of Middleburg in Hardeman County Tennessee now occupied by said son be sold by Commissioners as above stated when my youngest son becomes of age one the time and terms mentioned in reference to the sale of the land on Short Creek and the proceeds to be divided in the same manner also I will and bequeath that my Negro Libby named Sallie shall be kept in the family and finally disposed of in the same manner as it is named in reference to the other three Negroes
