

Miles Burns Will.

In the Name of God Amen. I Miles Burns of the County of Harrison and State of Tennessee being weak in body though in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God, feeling the vanity of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and bequeath this my last Will and Testament, that is to say I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God, that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried, in decent Christian form of Burial, not doing anything but I shall receive the same, again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God, to bless me in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner, and form Viz.

Item the my Land and Estate in Marshall County State of Mississippi designated as follows, Section 31 Township 2, and Range One west six hundred and forty acres lying on the Head of Cold Water, I wish to remain undivided, until the Youngest Heir becomes of age, and then to be equally divided in 9 Equal shares, Each of the Legates of Miles Burns to hold them and their heirs forever, my family to reside on the part I allowed to settle on myself, and my Eldest son Charles Burns to remain where he is now living, and also free to the use of any other Heir, here that may wish to settle on said tract of land, to my Eldest son, Charles Burns I give and bequeath my boy Abner and Hannah to my second son Jacob Burns I give and bequeath, my Boy Jerry Cotton by his refunding One hundred of Eight Dollars of 14 Cents as an own ratio of his share - of the slaves to be paid in three years from the date, my Daughter Elizabeth C. Taylor, I give and bequeath, Orris and Lizza to her and her heirs forever, also a balance of thirty six Dollars to be paid her when those that have own their amount, is paid my Daughter, Mary Eltham, I give and bequeath, to her and her heirs Ruth and Elizabeth also a balance of thirty six Dollars to be paid her when the residue is collected, my third son - William Burns I give and bequeath my Boy Frank and Eliza by his refunding three years One hundred and forty Eight Dollars 25 Cts to the Executors shares to my fourth son Nathan Miles Burns - I give and bequeath my negro Boy Betty and Girl Hannah

aged 7 years old also fifteen Dollars and 75 Cts to 50 Cts his heirs in three years - to my youngest daughter Ursula Ann Burns I give and bequeath, to her and heirs my Girl Martha and Boy Henry also One hundred and twenty five Dollars 75 Cts to be paid in three years out of the residue (entirety) from the largest share - to my fifth son James Love Boy by his refunding my Negro Boy Ben and Harriess by his paying back eight Dollars and 25 Cts in three years - to my sixth son Jasper B. Burns I give and bequeath to my sixth son George B. Burns also fifty Cts, my Negroes Mary, George & Solomon also fifty Cts, my Dollars, and twenty five Cts, to be paid him, in three years to make his share, Equal with the others, all the hands to remain on the farm until all the crop, is completely housed and disposed of my fifth, to be settled out of the proceeds of any present crop, provided there is a efficiency and if not there is two Horses & two Yokes of Work Steers, to make it out, sufficient, and any residue remaining, after my last fifth is settled, if enough, I wish my daughter Mary to have a Horse saddle and Bridle to be valued (equal) to the one that Elizabeth C. Taylor has and save the Balance if any; One Horse to William and one to Balance if any; One Horse to William Burns get the Young Boy James with one eye, and miles Burns get the Young boy with both eyes also my daughter Ursula Ann, the saddle and Bridle to be valued equal to Elizabeth C. Taylor's Horse saddle and Bridle each of the Legates to have one Bed, and furniture the Table, to be for the use of the family and any Balance that may be remaining to be Equally divided among the Heirs, the stock of cattle Hogs and sheep, to go to the use of the family, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 26th day of September, in the Year of Our Lords Eighteen Hundred and thirty six.

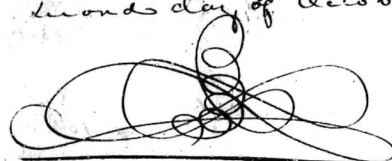
