In the Name of God Amme: I Miles Burns of the County of Harrison and State of Tennessee being weak in body though in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God
Almighty to avoid the Mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is to say I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of Almighty God, that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian form of Burial, not doubting but I shall receive the same, assured by the Mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner, and form Viz.

Item To my Landed Estate in Marshall County State of Mississippi designating as follows, Section 31 Township 2, on Range One west, six hundred and forty acres lying on the Head of Cold Water, I wish to remain undivided, until the Youngest Son becomes of age, and then to be equally divided in 9 Equal shares, Each of the Daughters of Miles Burns to hold their and their heirs forever, my family to abide on the part I allowed to settle on myself and my Eldest son Charles Burns to remain where he is now living, and also for to the use of any other other, heirs that may wish to settle on said tract of Land, to my Eldest son, Charles Burns I give and bequeath my Bay Horse and Tram to my Second son Jacob Burns I give and bequeath, my Bay pony & Caster by his refunding One hundred of Eight Dollars & 14 cents as an over actio of his share of the slaves to be paid in three years from the date, my Daughter Elizabeth C. Tigar I give and bequeath, Orris and Lizzie to her and her heirs forever, also a balance of Thirty six Dollars to be paid her, when those that have over their amount, is paid my Daughter Mary Edwards I give and bequeath, to her and her heirs Ruth and Elizabeth also a balance of Thirty six Dollars to be paid her when the residue is collected, my third son William Burns I give and bequeath my Bay Frank and Eliza by his refunding in three years One hundred and forty Eight Dollars 25^{cts} to the Aleckus slaves to my fourth son Nathan Miles Burns I give and bequeath my negro Boy Party and Girl Hambo

aged 7 years old also fifteen Dollars and 75 cents to his
hus in three years to my youngest daughter Ursley Ann Burns
I give and bequeath, to her and her heirs my girl Martha and
Boy Henry also One hundred and twenty five Dollars 75
cents to be paid in three years out of the residue collected
from the largest slaves to my fifth son James Lee Burns
I give and bequeath my Negro Boy Ben and Harris son by
his paying back eight Dollars and 75 cents in three years
to my death to Jasper C. Burns I give and bequeath
to my negroes Harry, George & Solomon also Sixty six
Dollars, and Seventy five cents to be paid him in three years
to make his share, Equal with the others, etc the lands to
remain on the farm until all the lots completely known
and disposed of my City to be settled. A sum of the proceeds
of my present Crop, provided there is a deficiency and
if not there is two Horses & Two Pairs of Horses, twelve
it out sufficient, and any remainder among the rest
just right as settl'd, if enough, I wish my daughter
Mary to have a Horse saddle and Bridle to be valued
Equal to the one that Elizabeth C. Tigar has, and another
Balance of any one Horse to William and one set to
Necles Burns & William Burns gets the Young Bay Horse
with one Eye, and Miles Burns gets the Young bay Whelply
also my daughter Ursley Ann the bonnie Blue Eyed
with saddle and Bridle to be valued by me to Elizabeth C.
Tigers Horse saddle and Bridle each of the Legatees to be
paid, and furniture the Table, to be for the use of
one Board, and furniture the Table, to be for the use of
the family and any Balance that may be remaining to
be Equally divided among the others in the stock of cattle kept
and sheep, to go to the use of the family In testamentoary
I have bequeath to any hand and office my seal, this
26th day of September, in the Year of our Lord Eighteen
Hundred and Thirty six.



3rd I give to my son William, my young son's slave Ricy 4th I give to my daughter Sally, my young son's slave Ricy 5th I give to my grand son, Madisons R. Hyder, my Old Piggy Money.

6th It is my request and desire that all descriptions balance of my property of all descriptions, after paying my just debts, that my beloved wife Sally have during widowhood, share, enjoy and have the use of, for the sum

of raising all my children, that are with her, and in case of her Death or marriage, all the property both real and personal she shall have the possession of, that I have not hitherto bequeathed, be sold and the proceeds, equally divided, amongst all my Children, after giving those who have not had a House, one of equal values, with those I have given a House to, & it is my Will and desire that my beloved wife Sally and my son John, be my Executors, to this my last will and testament, Lastly, I do hereby invoke all wills or Wills, hereof made, by me, In testimony whereof, I have written set my hand and affixed my seal, this twenty first day of July 1830.
