3^d My Will & desire is that all the residue of my estate remaining af
ter the bequests hereby made and after the deeds of gift made by

testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

I will that that the balance of my negroes should be equally
divided between my Children or their Representatives, which
I have had by my second & present wife taking into the amount
the negro's that I have heretofore given to those of my
children by my second wife

I will that the balance of my estate then remaining after
complying with the requisitions herein made shall be sold and
after all my just debts shall be paid the proceeds to be equally
divided amongst all of my children by my second & present
wife. In this will I have not given any negro to my
sons Richd & Nathaniel or to their representatives for the reason
that I conceive that they have already received their equal parts
of my negro estate

I hereby appoint my Friends Edmund & D. Farmer & Son
O. B. moment executors to this my last will & Testament

I do my surplus property to be sold or a sufficient sum to pay my debts. It is my desire that the remainder remain with my wife for her benefit and the education of my daughter Agnes until she becomes of age or marries. Then the surplus if any after paying Agnes two thousand dollars as her portion mentioned to remain with my wife Ann A. Dandridge, for her benefit during her lifetime and then the surplus if any to be equally divided between my daughters Mildred Back, and Agnes A. Dandridge. It is my desire that my beloved wife Ann A. Dandridge execute this my last will and testament.

I give in Trust also to my said Executrix, the aforesaid property when purchased, for the use and benefit of my said Father and Mother, during each of their natural lives, Seventy - It is my will and desire that my said Executrix purchase at the earliest convenient time, after my death, a horse worth some thirty or seventy Dollars, which horse I will bequeath to my sister Julie Ann Anderson, and it is my will and desire that my sister Julie Ann Anderson, may during the life time of my said Father and Mother, or until she may marry, live with my said Father and Mother, and enjoy in part, the benefit of the aforementioned property - Set apart in this will for their benefit. 
