Hardeman County } In the name of God amen. I Ony S. Harvey of said
County and State being of sound mind and memory (blessed be almighty God
for the same) But knowing the uncertainty of this life do make and publish
this my last Will & Testament, that is to say, 1st I give to my beloved wife Ann
one hundred and twenty two acres of Land that is seventy two acres that I
bought of Overton and the fifty acres that I bought of Mr. Harvath also one
negro man Granville, and one negro woman named Mary for and during her
natural life, and after the death of her my said Wife, said Land &
negro to be equally divided, my Children, I also give to my said wife one
horse, and ladies saddle, two Cows & Calves, two sheep, pigs, two Beds, Bedsteads
and furniture and a suitable and reasonable portion of such other household
hold, kitchen furniture, and farming utensils as she may need together
with one years provisions, 2nd I give and bequeath the tract of Land wherein
I now live containing between five hundred and six hundred acres, my Young
-est & Children those by my last wife to be equally divided among them.
The negroes intended for these Children and my son Walter & his
-ghter Harriet Walls are conveyed to them by deed of gift.
3rd My Wife & desire is that all the residue of my estate remaining of
-ter the bequests hereby made and after the debts of gift made by
me are satisfied shall be equally divided between my children or their
legal heirs that may then be living. Lastly I do hereby appointing
worthy friend Joseph J. Williams executor of this my last will and
Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 28th day of November one thousand eight hundred and
thirty eight.

That is to say I commend my body to the grave and my spirit to God who gave it. My Will is that my Factory, land and every thing pertaining thereto as connected therewith shall be sold - and that my executor shall buy a suitable tract of Land in this County for my wife Sally or where she may choose to reside which she is to have and enjoy during her natural life.

And I wish that my beloved wife Sally shall have such negroes out of my estate as she may choose provided she should choose no more than a Child's part - and that she have such portion of my household & Kitchen Furniture and stock as she may need paying due respect to her former habits and Rank in life.

I will that that the balance of my negroes should be equally divided between my Children or their Representatives, which I have had by my second & present wife taking into the amount the negroes that I have heretofore given to those of my Children by my second Wife.

I will that the balance of my estate then remaining after complying with the requisitions herein made shall be sold and after all my just debts shall be paid the proceeds to be equally divided amongst all of my Children by my second & present wife. In this Will I have not given any negroes to my sons Richd & Nathaniel or to their representatives for the reason that I conceive that they have already received their equal portion of my negro estate.

I hereby appoint my Friends Edmund D. Farver & John E. Norment executors to this my last will & Testament.

I give to my sons Richd & Nathaniel fifteen hundred dollars - and each which is to be paid them out of the Proceeds of my estate mentioned in the 6th Item of this will in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 1st day of June 1839 Nathaniel E. Norment
