James Jones Will

In the name of God Amen I James Jones of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but laboring under bodily infirmities & knowing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, do make, ordain, constitute & declare this my last Will and Testament as follows: First, I bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Jones the use of the tract of Land wherein I now live, containing about one hundred and thirty six acres, the part I have cultivated for my pastured use for some years past, including the wood lands on the said part of said tract also a negro man by the name of Peter, also a negro woman by the name of Sally & her increase, together with all the monies due me as a my possession at my decease, including all farming utensils, household and kitchen furniture, Wagon & Blacksmiths tools, together with all grain and provision of my description on hand at my decease, also the stock of uncut cattle, sheep & hogs in my possession at my decease, the aforesaid names property to I leave & at aforesaid to my beloved wife, during her natural life for her use & benefit, & for her support & maintenance until her decease, & then, I give & bequeath to my son, Wiley Jones for the love & affection I have for him, after my decease the following property viz, One hundred acres of Land the balance of the tract wherein I live on the State of Working River being the place of his residence at the time together with all appurtenances thereto belonging, also a negro man by the name of Arch, also a negro man by the name of Sandy, after the decease of my wife Rebecca Jones, I give & bequeath to my son Wiley Jones the following property viz, the tract of Land wherein I live containing about one hundred and thirty six acres, also a negro man by the name of Peter, also a negro woman by the name of Sally together with such increase as she may have after this time, also One half of the Hogs belonging to aforesaid plantation also all stock of cattle, sheep & horses, not otherwise disposed of, remaining on hand also all farming utensils, Wagon Blacksmiths tools, grain provisions &c. Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Abster, Seming for the love and affection I have for her, the following property viz, after my decease I devise to her the sum of twenty Dollars to be paid out of any money belonging to my Estate not otherwise appropriated, after the decease of my wife Rebecca Jones, I bequeath One half of the stock of Hogs, to Betty A. Seming if the aforesaid Betty A. Seming have another heir during life, the said heir shall share with her other children in the property willed to them, share and share alike, with the exception of a reserve of One hundred acres of Land, devised to James W. Seming on the West side of said tract, also exclusive of Negro man Ephraim, I also devise to Betty A. Seming, after the decease of my wife Rebecca Jones, One half of the Bed & furniture not otherwise

expressed in my Will, belonging to my place of Residence, on Rocky River,
 Secondly, I give and bequeath to my grand daughter, Sally Minick, daughter of
 Lewis of Land lying on the East side of the River I bought of Peter R. Smith
 on the Waters of Fish Creek, to be taken in a degree from the North east
 corner of said tract of Land, also to the said Sally Minick, a
 house named Duck, together One Bed & furniture, also One fourth part
 of the household and Kitchen furniture, belonging on the aforesaid
 premises, expressed at this time by Peter S. Denning, the above devise
 is for the love and affection I have for her, also One side saddle, One
 pair of calf including an Equal share of all the provisions & grain
 on hand at my decease, Thirdly, I give and bequeath to Eliza Jones
 Denning, immediately after my decease to be for her benefit a Negro
 girl named Minerva, also One bed & furniture, One half of the house
 hold & Kitchen furniture, after the decease of my wife Rebecca.
 Jones, also One hundred Dollars to be paid or hereafter named by
 Peter S. Denning as Trustee of her children Sally, Eliza and James
 also after the decease of my wife Rebecca Jones, One Loom, the above
 devise to Eliza S. Denning is given for the Love and Affection I have
 for her, Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my grandson James Winchester
 Denning for the Love and Affection I have for him, the balance of the
 aforesaid Tract of Land, on the Waters of Fish Creek, containing
 about One hundred and Ninety Acres together with all appurtenances
 thereto belonging all the stock of Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, not otherwise
 disposed in my Will, all the farming utensils, and property of every de-
 scription not otherwise devised, I also give to the said James Winchester
 a Negro man by the name of Ephraim, and a Negro girl by the name
 of Mary, also One half of all the household & Kitchen furniture, on or
 belonging to said plantation, on Fish Creek, or the Waters thereof,
 also One third part of all the grain and provisions of every kind
 on hand at my decease, on the said place, Fifthly, I give and bequeath
 to my grand daughter Patsy Empress or Jones, a Negro girl by the name
 of Melinda, also One half of the Kitchen furniture and Cooking utensils,
 One bed & furniture, One Cow & calf, and One side saddle, Explicitly,
 I do hereby constitute and appoint declare and confirm, Patsy Alston
 Denning as Trustee to take the property of her children that is
 Sally Minick, Eliza Jones & James Winchester Denning into her
 care and keeping as Trustee for the same after my decease,
 which property will as devised by me then become subject to
 the benefit of said children, and I hereby authorize her to dis-
 pose of the profits of said property, for their benefit in raising
 and schooling, maintaining such children & paying all such
 expenses as she may deem expedient for their benefit before
 they become of age, And I further appoint Patsy Denning

to dispose of Trusts for the payment of the aforesaid debts, a Negro man
 by the name of Isaac and apply the same and Dollars of the money to the
 use of Eliza Jones Denning, when she becomes of age, the residue to
 be applied to a debt I owe my father Edmund Jones, I also author-
 ize Patsy Alston Denning to, dispose of a Trust, for the payment of
 the aforesaid debt, due Edmund Jones, the Tract of Land whereon
 I formerly lived, on the Waters of Jones Creek, and apply the same to
 the same, I leave the Negroes on my Plantation on Fish Creek, to
 be disposed of as follows to be put in a Lot and drawn for when the
 children of Eliza S. Denning become of age, each to draw an Equal
 part, provided she shall have more hand, she shall have an Equal
 part share and share alike, the shares of no more hand shall
 be Sally Minick Denning, Eliza Jones Denning & James Winchester
 Denning, the Negroes to be drawn will be as follows, Lucy and all
 her increase after this time, My, together, Jackson, William, at this
 time and all increase after until drawn, Lastly, I hereby make
 known that it is my will, and pleasure that my property be not
 exposed to Public Sale, after my decease, but that reasonable title
 amount to the plan in the division of the same, agreeable to the
 true intent and meaning of this my Last Will and Testament, In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of
 October Anno Domini 1832,
