Carnes (in addition to his Negro man Nels, One Negro Man named Model, One Servant Man called Manee, his saddle of Bridle, Bedstead, Bed of furniture, and Quilt. Also his Board & support so long as he is agreeable and willing to be controlled by his Mother and suffer his hands and hands to remain in common stock, upon which condition, he shall receive an equal share of the Netty proceeds with the Mother and her children, to whom reference is made below. But if he is not willing to be controlled by his Mother, then my desire is that the Court appoint Stephen Larnam his Guardian, 4th as Respectfully my Daughter Rebecca Lay and my Son James A. Carnes I consider that they have both Received their equitable share in money and property already given them. 5th I give and bequeath to my Son Robert H. B. Carnes One Negro Woman named Frank, five hundred dollars to be paid by my Executors, One Mule called Joe and forty dollar more, One Bedstead Bed of furniture two Cows & Calves, and two horses & pigs (average quality) on credit, provided the same be received at full satisfaction for all claims against me in all and every case at his Guardianship. 6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza B. Hall One Negro Girl named ~~Eliza~~ Mary and One Brown filly called Felt, in addition to what she had already received. 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary A. Carnes, the following Negroes, Dicy, Ransom and Margaret, also her Board & support on the place, if she wishes to remain with her Mother and will let her Negroes remain on the place in the common stock, until she comes of age or Marries, also I give her one Horse Bridle of saddle, and about the amount of other stock that my daughter, Rebecca and Eliza Received, also one Bureau, One Bedstead, Bed of furniture provided it is all received at full satisfaction of all claims against me in all and every case at his Guardianship

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 8th I give and bequeath to my blood wife and all my children by last marriage all the Residue of my property both Real and personal, subject however to my debt and liability to be held in One common stock, during her Natural life or widowhood, for their support and Education the Mother and the Child, to share alike, of all both Real & personal, and as the Children become of age or Marry then Mother with the assistance of any other Executor can give them something like their equitable share in that way which will be least prejudicial to the interest of the family or the other Children, as the Children some of lawful age may and claim their portion in the same way, it must all be given at a fair valuation, of three disinterested men, appointed by my Executors. It is my will and desire that during my wife's Natural life or widowhood the slave Mary shall be kept on the place, in common stock, under the control of my heirs after named Executors, and they are hereby authorized at all times, to dispose of any surplus stock, property or Crop, On such terms and credit as they think most advisable, and out of the proceeds of the same, purchase such Animals or Tools or any other article as they think necessary for the Farm or for the support, of the family or Education of the children, keeping at all times a true account of such proceeds, expences and making a return annually of the same to the clerk of the Court of this County. But in case of Marriage or Death of the Mother, then a Guardian to be appointed by the Court, to attend to the Children's interest, in case of Marriage the Mother is to receive her part of all both Real and personal, an equal share with all the surviving Children, to be received according to valuation, as already described, her portion of the Real Estate only to be kept during life, and her portion of the personal Estate to be hers in life and at her disposal in death. When a Guardian shall be appointed for the Children, he may sell such part of the perishable property belonging to the Children as he thinks most advisable, and as the Court may direct. But in case of the death of the Mother, while her one of the Children are in Minor years then the Guardians to sell all the personal property except the slaves, on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided between all my Children in last marriage, also at the death of the Mother or at soon after as may be ^{found to be} advisable, that any surviving Executor or some One appointed by the Court for that purpose, should to sell all my landed Estate, On a credit of One two and three years of equal payments, taking priority with approved Securities, reserving the title of the land until the last payment is made, and at the time of said sale should there be any debt indebted, that said Estate was at the time

D. of furniture which I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hatley to be disposed among the children as she may think expedient, and the proceeds to be equally divided among my several children except my beloved daughter Mariah Wall who it is my will and wish shall have four hundred dollars less than an equal portion of my Estate, in consequence of my having advanced to her that amount on and above an equal share with my other heirs.

4th It is my will that my Negro property be laid off in lots by intelligent citizens selected by my Country as equal in value as possible, corresponding with the number of my children and the least valuable lot to be made equal to the most valuable with money derived from the proceeds of the sale of my other property.
5th One lot I give and bequeath to my beloved son Richard Hatley, One do to my son Pappley P. Hatley, One do to my son John Hatley, One lot I give and bequeath to my grand children the heirs of the body of my beloved daughter Elizabeth Echols, including a negro slave but not more than 4

by the name of Cornelia. My last and wish is that my beloved Daughter Elizabeth have the use and benefit of this property during her life time; One Other I left to my Grand Children the heirs of the Body of my beloved Daughter Mary Gorsett including a Negro hitherto placed in her possession by the name of Frances - My Will is that my beloved Daughter Mary have the use and benefit of the property during her life time; One Other I left to my Grand Children the heirs of the Body of my beloved Daughter Mariab Wall including a Negro by the name of Peter, My Will is that my beloved Daughter Mariab have the use and benefit of the same during her life; all subject to the law given to my beloved Wife Henry Wall, which is intended to procure for her a good ~~living~~ sufficient & comfortable support and attention during her life;

6th In the event of my Children or any One of them refusing to support or contribute to her Comfort, in any Way, it is then made her duty and privilege, to take possession of and hire out as many Negroes as may be sufficient to procure for her a full & ample support, and whatever may contribute to the Comfort of life.
