We the Commis are of Opinion, that the Crop and other
produce of Joint Labor be divided according to the hands
employed of each, given under our hands & seal the 12th
day of Dec 1842.

Articles of Agreement made and entered into. On the thirteenth day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty two, by and between John Nuckolls of the County of Hardeman and State of Tennessee of the One part & Dolly Vaughan of the County & State aforesaid Of the Other part, Witnesseth that the said Dolly Vaughan hath this day given up unto the possession, care, Control and management of the S^d John Nuckolls her two Children at his own Town, Cordova her Daughter who was born the 24th day of February One Thousand eight hundred and Thirty Nine, and her son Thomas, Benton who was born the 11th day of April One Thousand eight hundred and forty, until they become of Lawful age, and further by their present joint Authorise and request the County Court of S^d County of Hardeman, to bind over the above named Children unto the S^d John Nuckolls for the Consideration, herein after mentioned Trust, S^d Nuckolls is to make said Children his Legal heirs, it to be that they are to be fed and brought up in a proper manner, and also to give them a good common Education, and further to permit S^d Dolly Vaughan to Visit said Children, at several times as she may wish, by her conducting herself in a proper & becoming manner while with them and S^d Nuckolls

further to permit John Vaughan the father of the said
Dolly Vaughan to remain on his premises, where he now lives,
his tenant so long as he may wish to remain there, provided
that Misfortune day not deprive said Mrs. Kelly of the title
premises, and sd. John Vaughan is to have Land to till
at the usual rate of Rent, &c. and the sd. Mrs. Kelly
both further agree not to remove sd. children out of sd.
County of Hardman, without the consent of the sd. Dolly
Vaughan, and the sd. John Kelly, and the sd. Dolly
Vaughan, the parties to this Instrument, both do mutually
agree that this Instrument be acted on and approved
by the County Court of Hardman, and be made a matter
of Record, in sd. County, and that no exception be
taken by either of the parties, either in Law or Equity,
to any part of the same in this instrument, but to
remain valid, and in full force on each, against
the contents specified, herein, given under each of
our hands and seals this day and date above written.
