William Johnston's Will

In the Name of God Amen

William Johnston of the County of Hardeman and State of Tennessee being of Sound Mind and Memory do make & constitute this my last Will & Testament working all others by me heretofore made in the manner following (To wit) Item 1st It is my will that my Executors sell my crop of Cotton at Public or private Sale and on such terms as they may think best and all other such perishable property as my beloved wife Susannah B. Johnston may not need nor want to keep & that my Executors collect all Monies due me & pay all of my Just debts. Item 2^d and it is my will that what Monies may be left over and above paying of my Just debts and with the Income of my Estate that my Executors have a plain comfortable dwelling house built for my beloved wife and Children accommodations at such times as they may think best and pay for such house out of such Monies as I have above named. Item 3^d I leave unto my beloved wife Susannah B. Johnston all of my property of all descriptions (Whatsoever during her Natural life or Widowhood for the purpose of her living Comfortably and raising and giving my beloved Children a good English Education from the means and profits of my Estate, the Capital of which is not to be touched for the above purpose and that my Negroes and property should be kept together as if I was alive but that nothing shall be wastefully destroyed but Economy and Comfort shall be the ruling principle, Item 4th It is my will at my beloved wife's second Marriage or at the death of my happy first (Wife) that in case of my wife's second Marriage

It is my will that she have a Child part of
all of my whole Estate to be hers forever and that
the balance of my Estate be put in one Common
Stock, and Managed in the best manner for
the benefit of my Children I wish my Executors to
buy out the Childrens Negroes, privately and in
families when they may be well treated and
out of the Treasures of my whole Estate to board &
school my beloved Children for it is my will
that they have a good English Education, and
when I say my Children I mean, George Johnson and
my Daughter Susannah Rebecca and my Son John
Rufford and such as may be bornes before my death
or in nine months after my death, and as my
Children comes of age - It is my will that my
Executors then divide my whole Estate and the
Child that is of age draw his equal part and
the balance of the property to fall back again
into one Common Stock, and be Managed as
before directed, and so on until all my Children
have received their equal parts, for it is my will
that my Children share alike in all things be-
longing to my Estate &c. Item 5th In Case there is
a surplus of Money over and above supporting
my beloved wife and Children my Executors may
lay it out in land or Negroes, for the benefit of
my Estate always having the right conveyance to
my Estate I leave this matter to their discretion
and Judgment, and when any of my Children
comes of age or marries, my wife can let them have
such property as they may or she can spare always
having it valued and account kept of it so as
to do Justice to them all, in all things &c.
Item 6th In Case of my wife's death it is my will

that my Executors person the same as directed
under the 4th Item. of this my will and as the direction
given in Case of my wife's death & Marriage &c.
Item 7th It is my will that my Son James and
his wife Isobel and Arthur shall be treated well
by my wife and Executors and to dispose of them
in such a manner as to take them down to their
graves in peace and I do give my Executors full
power over these three Negroes, and doing a very all
former direction given in this my will for the full
accomplishment of this my will Concerning of them
Indubitably leaving it to their Judgment of my Executors
Item 8th It is my will that my Books be kept and
carefully preserved between my Children.

Item 9th And do bequeath unto my beloved wife S. M.
Johnson and my Children and family and relations
the joys and blessings of a Husband and the same as
a father and friend to my Children and do recommend
to them all the Religion of Jesus Christ, Only Son
and Son of God. I now do constitute and appoint my
beloved Brother Andrew M. Johnson and my
friend William Moon my Executors to this
my last will & Testament April 18th 1837. In Testimony
