Fifthly — I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anna Candlerly One hundred Acres of Land being the lower End of the tract formerly purchased of John Cooper also one negro Slave named Mary.

Sixthly — I give and bequeath to the heirs of the Body of Elizabeth Ogden my Deceased Daughter my negro Slave named Lucy and her Infant Child named Brown.

The twenty acres of Land I bequeath to my Wife shall be taken between Lewis Williams and Nancy Wood.

All the residue of my property I desire to be sold and equally divided among my heirs. I hereby appoint Lewis Williams and Charles Wood Executors of my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
