He is as follows to wit.

In the name of God Amen. That I Thomas Layton of the County of Hardin and in the State of Tennessee being in an English State of Health tho' in perfect sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament. I first Recommend my body to be buried in the dust from which it came in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors. My Soul I Recommend into the hands of God who gave it. And such worldly Estate as it has been pleased God to Ordain me with I wish to have distributed in a manner as follows. I first lend unto Priscilla my beloved Wife the house and plantation whereon I now live with fifty acres of Land there with together with all my whole house hold goods and Chattels in done and due and stock of all kinds during her life or widowhood. Secondly I give unto my daughter Mary Ann James one dollar in money

to her and her heirs forever. Thirdly I give unto Mary Ann James Children Lawfully begotten one hundred and fifty Dollars in money to be kept by my Executors till they become of age; to them and their heirs forever. and after the death or marriage of my wife Priscilla Layton I wish to have the whole of my Estate Equally divided between my four other Children named William Lawry Layton Thomas Layton George Zachariah Layton and Martha Angelina Layton and the Remainder of my Lands not lent to my wife Priscilla Layton to be Equally divided betwixt four last above named Children Thomas Layton William Lawry Layton George Zachariah Layton and Martha Angelina Layton as they become of age to them and their heirs forever.

Last of all I do appoint my two sons William Lawry Layton and Thomas Layton to be my sole Executors to act for me after I am gone.
