October 28th day in the year of our Lord 1844

Samuel Cartour being no health & in my right mind & Memory do make this my last will and Testimony knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make this my last will & Testimony I first gave and submit my Soul to Almighty God who gave it. I secondly give my beloved wife Nancy half the tract of land I now live on and she is to have choice of sides during her life time or Widows-hood then it goes to Samuel R. Cartour also my black servants to remain with her to support her from

Samuel R. Cartour during her life time or widow hood & not to wife but at her death by Marriage to be equally divided with my Infanted Children which I shall hereafter name & all other property he said Samm Cartour is to pay my just debt & the balance shewing his or wife equally divide with my children during her Natural life time or Widows-hood after all is made over to one cent.
