Last Will & Testament of Samuel Harbour Decd

October 35th day in the year of Lord 1841

I Samuel Harbour being in health & in my right mind & memory do make this my last will and Testament knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make this my last will & Testament. I first gave and submit my soul to Almighty God who gave it. I secondly gave my Beloved Wife Nancy half the tract of land I now live on and she is to have choice of sides during her life time or Widowhood then it goes to Samuel Kate Harbour also my Black Servants to remain with her to support her graine

Samuel Harbour's Will Continued

Samuel Harbour during her life time the meadow tract of land to which but at her death to be equally divided with my Impudent Children which I shall hereafter name & all other property the said Nancy Harbour is to pay my just debt of this balance she may keep or divide equally divided with my children during her natural life time or Widowhood after all is made over to her and I 3^{rdly} gave & Bequeath to my son Elijah Harbour two tracts of land one of One hundred & two Acres three eighths of 11 Acres of Land adjoining to him where he now lives including my old mill seat with its butts and bounds forever & his Impudent Children forever Valued at 12 hundred Dollars then two Negro boys and named Elias & One named Sampson Valued at \$1000 then two horses Valued to seven hundred & 75 Cents that is the 2 negro and two horse best and other things in all amounts to Five thousand and Eighty Dollars which I gave to him and his Impudent Children for ever Nancy Omeline Kiser my Daughter I gave three tracts of Land on which she now resides and Cultivates one of Twenty acres and Two of Eighty acres each the whole amounts to one hundred 20 acres after giving of it 40 acres for a meeting house and School House there remains one hundred and 40 acres of land with its butts and bounds also one black girl named Myer at \$500 Dollars and the Land at Eleven hundred and fifty Dollars also one black boy named Jonathan Valued at one hundred and 40 Dollars also 1 gray mare at \$75 Sheep and Beasts 2 Bed Sticks and furniture other things to the amount of one hundred and Ten Dollars keep and all small things but no cattle I gave to her and the children of her one Baddy forever and to no other person or persons the whole amount is 21.00

I also gave to my Daughter Matilda one Robinson 2 tracts of Land adjoining to her one 40 acres and the other 30 acres of Land when she now lives and occupies with its butts and bounds the whole amounts one hundred and 60 acres of Land Valued at one thousand Dollars also 1 negro Boy named Green and yellow girl

We the undersigned freeholders of Hardin County after being duly
sworn have proceeded to set apart to Rachel Smith Widow of Jesse
Blount deceased as much of the crop and provisions on hand as
