except so much as is claimed by my daughter Siba Harrison
which I design her to have, with the further understanding
that he the said Bureau Harrison is to pay the several
bequests herein provided and that he pay to my said daughter
to Siba Harrison, the sum One hundred dollar, when
she my wife for the same, at time when I design for
her no room and share of a portion of the land, and I
do hereby nominate and appoint my son Bureau Harrison
the Executor of this my last will and testament, witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the
12th day of September 1855

The last will and testament of Mary Clumming late Mrs. and deceased 6th day of
April 1868, which is as the words and figures following to wit:

I Mary Clumming of some mind & memory which is gone hence
but Considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, therefore do
publish the following to be my last will & testament, by this publishing all that
which I may have made.

In view of facts hereinafter mentioned; that whereas under the last will of
my husband William Clumming, Esqne & Testator on the 16th day of October
1860, certain specific personalty was left to me, to my self & unto the
peace, to wit, Two Negro girls, then a Slave, leading the children, and also the
Stock, horses, hogs, sheep & other cattle, also the farming implements & the house
holder & Kitchen furniture of my late espouse, and the said William
Clumming, Mentioning the sum of Money given and paid or to be paid
to his children, Henry Clumming & Mary Davis and other property principally
shares and the paying of his lands in accordance with his will
giving a part thereof to his son Alfred another part during my lifetime
also to my Mary Clumming - then to William Clumming & his wife
in said last will that it was his will for William Clumming to leave
with me to manage the farm to me the above mentioned land & equity
to me first & succeeded to him the said Wm Clumming, also to
provide my house on the said tract of land. As the said Wm
Clumming so caring and half of all moneys then after paying
necessary expenses to be liquidated & paid off the sum of two thousand
and five hundred dollars, per year on the said tract of land going
to him at my death, to the Executrix of the Estate of said William
Clumming my husband & the testator in the above mentioned will the
sums by him made & signed to test, on the 16th day of October 1860, and
whereas great & marked changes have taken place since the publication
of said last will & testament, and since the death of said testator
William Clumming, Slave freed, great loss sustained in every other
kind of property, hens, hogs, sheep etc.

And having thus nothing over & above a livelihood for the family &
Said money incidental or necessary expenses were realized off the said tract
of land, given to me during my natural life, I now to
W. S. Clumming during the last twelve years.

Therefore I Mary Clumming feel it my duty & here nominate and
appoint to said last will of my husband Clumming to test,
it is my will & claim that Mary Clumming have the sum of one
dollar to be paid out of the effects of my estate, but having already
having been ample provided for by his will as shown and

Mary Armstrong's will continued.

(the 3rd William Armstrong's last will.)

3rd It is also my will & desire that the children & heirs at law of my Son Alfred Armstrong, deceased be paid the sum of one thousand dollars of my effects that Father the said William Armstrong having been amply provided for by the said William Armstrong's last will.

3rd It is further my will & desire that few I bequeath the sum of one thousand dollars to my daughter Mary & Pearl my daughter have the sum of one thousand dollars to her part of the share of the effects in my estate, she having been provided for by her father the said William Armstrong's last will & testament.

1st All the rest & residue of my property of whatever species whatever notes & bills in action or other evidences of debt all the Stock Horses, hogs, Sheep & other Cattle, all the household & Kitchen furniture all the farming utensils all the grain that may be on hand at my death, & the same is hereby declared to be the property of William Armstrong my son, with whom I am now residing but living at the home of his widow since the death of my husband his father.

5th I also give & bequeath to him the said William Armstrong all the interest I have or may hereafter acquire in the one half of the property belonging to said farm or which he now has & of which he now & receive one half & the other, and it is my desire that he be not held responsible for any of said one half which has accrued & may accrue after accrues, as my moiety of said property and I hereby relinquish to him all claims for the same.

I Polly Anderson do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may die possessed of or may forth come into the hands of my Executor.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my Son Amprado Anderson my town lot in Rogersville On bed and bedding one bureau and safe on block and stove and all my looking utensils and also one cow and calf one wagon and Fifteen head of hogs six chairs one dining Table and small Table and all so fifty five dollars due by Geo. Netherland to be paid in term in the fall 1866 and all my shelf ware and all my farming utensils

Secondly

I will and bequeath to my grand son Henry Johnson one Spicel box

Thirdly

I give and bequeath to Leodda Many and her son one bed to be equally divided between them three Dorothy I will and bequeath that my son Amprado pay to said wife William & Walter Blevins twenty five dollars each

Fourthly

I do hereby nominate and appoint William A. C. as my Executor in witness whereof I do to this my Will set my hand and seal this the 31st day of March 1866
