Secondly, I will and bequeath all of my Estate whether it
consists of money, notes, bonds, goods, chattels or any other
property, whatever, or whether it be my property or in
the possession of any other person for me to my three Sisters
to wit, Jane B. Sarah Ann, and Mary Ann Cunningham to be
equally divided between them, I have and I have alike and
if either of my Sisters should not survive me, then to the
Survivors Share & Share alike, and if but one should survive me,
then to be had absolutely, the whole of my estate, and if neither
of said Sisters should survive me, then it my will that my whole
Estate shall go to my brother James B. Cunningham absolutely and
I do hereby appoint my brother James B. Cunningham Executor of
this my last will and testament.
