

Copy of the last will of Elizabeth Ingsby's wife
 Executed & proven 2nd day of April 1877.

In the year of our Lord One thousand eight
 hundred and seventy one, November 25th day 1871.

I Elizabeth Ingsby have the day made
 and do make this my last will and testament and
 publish this as the said hereby making and making void
 all other wills by me at any time made &c

1st my wife and desire is that as soon after my death is
 practicable, I wish my just debts including my funeral
 expenses to be paid out of any money that may come to
 to my representatives hands out of my personal estate.

2nd I give my daughter Elizabeth Ann Beck and Ruth my daughter
 to Sarah White in part, the same with neither, my son James
 my clock & wagon, I give to my grand daughter, Winney
 Caroline Briggs by my son, Cambridge. The remainder of all my
 personal property including my money to be sold or coming
 to the highest bidder and all the money after my debts
 are paid to be divided among my children as follows.

My son John Ingsby and my daughter Winney self one
 dollar each, and the balance to be equally divided between
 the rest of my children to wit, Henry Ingsby, James Ingsby
 I leave, John Ingsby, Samuel Ingsby, James Ingsby
 Elizabeth Ann Beck, Jennie White, Martha Long
 &c &c. And I wish, to have the said son's part of my
 clothing can be divided equally and agreeable with my son
 his share equals in this will, I would rather, than

were to be sold and the proceeds divided as before
 I now give to my son James Ingsby, a certain
 piece of land being fifty acres more or less said
 tract of land was due to me by my father Hiram
 Goodrich, including my land share and building.

I do nominate ^{and appoint} my son James Ingsby, my Executor
 to my last will and testament, in witness whereof I do
 to this my last will. Set my hand and seal this
 the 25th day of November 1871

Copy of the last will & testament of Wm R. Conner dec'd
 Executed and proven this 2nd day of April 1877.

In the name of God Amen, this the 20th day of February,
 in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy
 seven, I William R. Conner, of the County of Hamilton and State
 of Tennessee, a gentleman being through the goodness of God
 in a sound State of mind and memory, but desiring to mind
 the frailty of life, and that it is appointed that I
 is appointed to all men one to die, do make and publish this
 my last will and testament this is to say, I myself and
 part of all I now own and may own unto the house of
 Almighty God; who gave me and the disposal of my
 body I leave to the entire disposal of my friends.

With respect to my worldly estate, I give bequeath and
 dispose of it in the manner and proportions here following.

First I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife
 Virginia all of my stock and all of my personal property in
 the house and out of doors also to collect and to have settle
 debts accounts and claims that is due me and she is to
 pay off all my just debts. Next I will and bequeath to her
 the tract of land that I now live on to have and to hold so
 long as she remains to be my widow, and at her death or if
 she dies she marries, I want her said children to have the
 same tract of land on which I now live to be equally divided
 between them, and I want the property that remains at
 her death or in case she marries, to be divided equally be
 tween my eight boys. Next I will and bequeath to my daughter
 for bequeath to have all of the estate that is coming to me or
 my heirs from the Pleasant Ridge estate.

Then I will and bequeath to my two oldest sons John
 and Paul Henry my three share in the tract of land that
 I have and bought from my father & mother estate and
 also I want them to have my three tract of land containing
 in a two acres to be equally divided between them and I do
 hereby utterly disclaim such and disclaim all and every
 other former testament wills, bequeath bequests and executions
 by me in any way before passing writing and bequeath
 satisfying and confirming this and no other to be my last will
 and testament.
