Copy of the last Will of George C Williams Dec'd from  
2<sup>d</sup> May of every A.D. 1874.

" I Geo C Williams, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby making and making void all others by me at any time made. First: I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible, out of any money that I may die possessed of or may find come into the hands of my Executor.

Secondly: I give and bequeath to my wife Ellen A. Williams, all the robes and gifts bequeathed by her Mother, deceased, situated in the Josephine block of Main St, New Haven, in what is known as Remond's addition to New Haven. Last ly, I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Mary A. Williams my Executor.

Be it known whereof I do to this my last Will set my hand this the three day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven.

"Stephen Hicks Will" probated October

1877

I Stephen Hicks of the County of Warren and State of Tennessee, do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby making and making void all other wills by me made at any other time. 1<sup>st</sup> I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible, but if any money that I may die possessed of or may leave in the hands of my children.

2<sup>nd</sup> I will and bequeath to Matilda Bailey and her heirs forever. She has any here living, and if the said Matilda Bailey should die without heirs then all of the lands and property that she may get of my estate, is to go back to my other child Almon, to wit: Mary Jane and Ellen. Further my wife is that Alfred Bailey the husband of my daughter Matilda is not to have any right to sell or part any of the lands that his wife may get. She may part the lands herself but neither of them, shall have any right to sell her part of said lands, as I have willed the same to her and her children, provided she has any children and if she, the said Alfred Bailey is never to have any of the funds that I will to his wife, as I do my wife the lands to his wife, and they do so provided she may have any children that may to the age of majority.

3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hicks the yotto, part of my lands, I will the land to her and her heirs forever. She may, have any heirs, and if no heirs at her death, the lands is to go back to the other children, that I have willed my lands to.

4<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my son James Hicks and his heirs provided he may have any, and if no children the same goes to the others of my children, that I have willed it to her. The said James Hicks, is to have the said fourth part of my lands.

5<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my daughter Ellen and her heirs, provided she may live to have heirs and fourth part of my lands, and if no heirs, the lands is to go back to the other heirs at her death, that I have willed my lands

6<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my Son Eliot, Samson  
- son as I have heretofore provided for him that  
is all I ever intend him to have, as I have given  
them what I think is his just in fact.

7<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to James Hicks and his heirs  
a equal part of my personal property and  
Money if I may have at my death, my Personal  
property is to be divided between myself and money  
that I may have at my death is to be divided  
equal between four of my children to wit: Mary  
James Thomas, and Ellen; or their heirs.

I will and bequeath to my Grand Children Julia  
Hicks, Isaac Hicks daughter fifty dollars in  
escheat, the fifty dollars to be paid to her by  
Thirteen years Mary and Ellen provide she may  
live to be twenty one years old.

8<sup>th</sup> My Lands is to be equally divided between Matilda  
Bailey formerly Matilda Hicks, James, Mary and  
Ellen, and my personal property is to be divided  
and money between James, Thomas, Mary and Ellen  
10<sup>th</sup> My will and require that there be no Administration  
no sale of property the heirs that I have given  
my lands and property, and select 2 or more men  
to divide the property and land without any  
Sale or Administration.

These all now by these presents that I James Hicks  
have here by will divided and laid off in lots  
to my fair Children mentioned in my will that  
that was to have my land at my death and this  
is to be attached to my will, as I have had with  
our said Survey and Comon and has plainly  
marked.

This Lot No. 1, laid off in the lower end of my  
lands, containing the lands of James Nautilus,  
the first Lot I give to my daughter Matilda  
Bailey formerly Matilda Hicks

Second Lot to either Nicky, Third Lot to Eliza Nicky, and the  
fourth Lot to James Hicks, when he now lives, the one thousand  
acres, and Matilda, Eliza and James, is each to receive one  
lot to build her a house as there is no house on his lot, I have  
divided and laid off my land as I intend, and from this  
date to have, as I have heretofore written to them:

Overside corner then due West 138 poles to a Stake on  
corner now down Marshes property, then S. 39° E. 80 poles  
to a Stake at the fence, then due North 34 poles to a  
Black oak hub in the corner of the fence then S. 60°  
130 poles to a white oak, then S. 35° W. 50 poles to a pole  
near the fence, then S. 38° W. 38 poles to a Stake on the

Bank, thus down the River as it Meanders, 60 poles to a Stake on the bank of the River, at the low water mark, thus S. 50° E., go pole to a Black Walnut, on the bank of the River, at a deep Cut, thus down the same as it Meanders, S. 45° W. 110 poles to a bunch of spinyones, then Willows on the Bank of the River, thus down the same as it Meanders, S. 45° W. 34 poles to a bunch of Willows, on the bank of the River, thus down with its Meanders, S. 45° W. 28 poles to a bunch of Willows, at the Stake corner between Niles Riverbed, and the beginning,

The first Lot and lower Lot Beginning at the Nuckles corner, thus S. 45° 28 poles to a bunch of Willows on the bank of the River, S. 55° E. 124 poles to a Stake thus of S. 56° E., 140 poles to a Stake on the top of the Ridge thus S. 58° E., 74 poles to a Maple on the top of the Ridge in the corner of the field on the cut side thus around with the line of the old Sun as to the beginning.

The second Lot Beginning at a bunch of Willows on the bank of the River, thus S. 45° E. 34 poles to a bunch of Willows, on the bank of at the low water mark thus South 55° E. 110 poles to a Stake when the old Meander line, thus underlined to be, thus S. 45° E. 54 poles to a Stake, at the corner of the fence, near the oak line thus S. 42° E. 27 poles to two Suga quince, then S. 42° E. 106 poles to Black quince, then the East 52 poles to a Poplar, thus S. 83° E., 34 poles, to 2 pines on old line thus around with Suga quice etc get to the line of lot 1st pr. and with same to beginning.

The third Lot Beginning on a bunch of Willows corner of lot 2d, thus up the River, as it Meanders S. 40° E., 40 poles to a large Nuttall, on the bank of the River, & at a deep Cut, thus S. 55° E. 100 poles to a Stake at a white oak, thus S. 55° E. 5 poles to a Stake in the Road, thus S. 45° E. 32 poles to spinyones, thus S. 72° E. 42 poles to a white oak thus S. 33° E. 42 poles to 2 Cedars, thus S. 71° E. 39 poles to a white Oak, near the corner of the fence thus S. 29° E. 20 poles to a Black Oak thus S. 80° E. 6 poles to 2 spinyones at the old Spiney oak corner, at the old Gate, thus around the old line
