

At Kitchell's farm at New Haven, I will make my last will and testament to above named Catherine Suer.

At New Haven
Sept 6th

1876.

The last, Will & Testament of George Suer Decd. I now & prove this 5th day of March 1877

This instrument made at the 11th day of February in the Year of our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and Twenty six, I having Suer in my later days and in my bedchamber, full as to my health this is my true mind, I proceed to make my last will for the benefit of all my children, consisting of boy and two girls, living and dead, this child being One living a boy. Their names is as follows George Suer, Jane Suer, Rebecca formerly Rebekah Suer, now Rebekah Turner wife of James Johnson and my grand son is named Francis Marion Bailey and being in my true mind, I will and bequeath unto George Suer my son all of my farm upon which I now live and my son George is to pay to my oldest daughter Jane two hundred dollars in Cash and also his to pay to my daughter Rebekah Turner one hundred and Seventy five dollars, in Cash and I will and bequeath unto my grand son Francis M. Bailey the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars, to be paid him when he comes to be twenty one years of age, my son George is also pay to Francis M. Bailey the sum of above mentioned when he comes of age.

I will and bequeath to my son George said farm as his property during his natural life at his death I will said farm to his heirs.

Being in my latter mind though full in health I proceed to make distribution of my personal effects among my children and grand child I will and bequeath to my daughter Jane our home that I now have in hands and my daughter Jane is to give to my daughter Rebekah a Coal at winning time and I also will and bequeath them my daughters Jane & to

also to give to my Grand Daughter M. Bailey and Coal at winning time and when Francis is of age, said is to be exempt from the payment of said Coal if any unmarried and childless person to the home that I give to said child she has said said Coal to Rebekah and Francis M. Bailey, and further I will my daughter Jane two miles from her in hands and also devotes Coal of the last acre of land near the Express Road of March 1877 give to Francis M. Bailey, and before at the time Francis becomes of age, I further will to my daughter Jane your home of Sheep that is now in hands to the balance of my it is to be equally divided between the other three children, George Rebekah & Francis M. Bailey, I have made a division of my real property to each as mentioned above but refers to my self the use of said property Rent for some paying my lifetime for my use and decent support in my afflictions or in health, at my death the property both Real and personal is to be distributed according to the winning of my last will & Testament.

After I will and bequeath to my son George at my death my one half interest in one wagon and one big Axe and hammer and my son George is to pay fifty dollars in Coal to be equally divided among the balance of my heirs Jane, Rebekah, and Francis M. Bailey, I will now direct to make distribution of my home and kitchen furniture that I have in hands as follows, I give to my daughter Jane her own bed and bedstead also wife to James Johnson of bedchamber now in hands and also I give to my daughter Rebekah one pair of bedchairs I have now in hands the balance of my home and kitchen furniture is to be sold at public sale and equally divided among my heirs George, Jane, Rebekah and Francis M. Bailey, I have made a distribution of my Real & personal effects among all my other heirs & grandsons and in my judgment though full in health by short notice.

And I therefore appoint my son George Suer as Executor of my last will. I have this the 11th day of February 1877, Paid my witness to be subscribe and have on this my mark to this instrument with the full knowledge of its contents this the Eleventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and Twenty six year.
