Copy of Alexander McCullough's Will.

I Alexander McCullough do make this
my last will and Testament hereby

2^d - I further will that my son
McCullough is to have what property
he has which he claims as his own
what money he has and the right
that all the rest of my estate is to
be equally divided between my wife
Eliza and my daughter Emily McCullough
including my lot and my house
division to be made when my daughter
Emily arrives at the age of eighteen
years.

3^d - And lastly I do hereby nominate
and appoint Mr. P. C. McCullough and that

personal property existing then shall belong
to the said John N. Long & Hugh R. Long
by them paying one hundred Dollars equal
to each lawful heir then living viz.
Eliatath, Nancy, Margaretta, David, William
Susanah, Catharine, Reabella & Orlean all
these six Children shall have the said
Hundred Dollars each if living at the
time of the death or marriage of my
Widow Hannahly - I want John R. Beckner
and Edward Walker if living at the de-
cease or marriage of my Widow (or either
of them by jointly & additional friends) to lay
off equally according to valuation my real
estate between the said John N. Long and Hugh
R. Long so as to avoid all other contingent
expenses And lastly I do hereby nominate
and appoint John N. Long my Executor in
witness whereof I do to this my will set
my hand and seal this 6th day of Oct 1865.
