Thirdly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret White a part of the farm on which I now live beside Beginning at a point on the line between J H Vance & my self about in p^{er} North East of the Spring house & running thence Westwardly to the Corner of a small orchard lot thence Southwardly with the present fence to the road so as to include the stable thence crossing the road over a small House and with the Calf lot fence to the South East Corner of Soia lot thence a Strait line Eastwardly to Soia Donas line and with Soia line Northwardly to the beginning including the Tan Yard Stabel small house on the South side of the Road and the Mansion House in which her Husband James White now resides

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Mitchell
McCluer the farm on which he now lives
known as the George Rones farm situate to the
one hundred & eighty two acres & lying about four
miles west of Rogersville on the main Road and I
require the said Mitchell McCluer to pay one half
of my debts which is charged on this bequest.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son Montgomery
McCluer the tract of land now in his possession
lying about eight miles west of Rogersville on the
main Road it being the same tract of land
conveyed to me by George Beets to which reference
is made for corners & distances & quantity and
I require the said Montgomery McCluer to
pay one half of my debts with which this bequest
is charged.

Sixthly I do not nominate & appoint my wife
Susannah executrix of this my will without
requiring her to give bond or qualifying
in testimony whereof I have written at my home
and affixed my seal this 7th day of June 1861.

The last will & testament of William Lyons,

I William Lyons of the County of Hancock and State
of Georgia being of sound disposing mind and memory at
advanced age considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty
of death and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs
with satisfaction to myself do make publish and declare the
following to be my last will and testament hereby revoking
and making void all other wills heretofore made by me.
It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of the first
money that may come into the hands of my executors hereinafter
named.

Secondly It is my will and desire that my son George be and shall be
the plantation on which he now lives and the adjacent place
and also the marshes place which I sold to him in the said
Georgia by purchasing said land a part of his share of my estate
after having first paid to me or my executors the Bonded debt
I hold on him for the purchase of a part of said land. I
also give him two negroes some years ago which I regard
as part of his share of my estate.

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my son David Lyons the Horse
plantation on which he now lives also fifty acres on the
north side of Houston River opposite said place also my share
in the marshes land said land having him paid for one of
the proceeds of the same the said David to
be my partner with me in said land also a negro boy named
George Eric Henry.

Fourthly I will and bequeath to my son David Lyons the plantation
on which he now lives known as the School Ridge farm upon
there is a nice new saw yard and the Henchels farm
and also the lot belonging to me in the town of Rogers-
ville lying south of the main road. I also give and bequeath
to my said son David all twenty acres of land lying upon the
branch above the saw yard upon which there is a Black
smith shop occupied by Ramon Morris. I also give to my
son David Mr. Some some years ago a negro boy David with
his children and a negro boy Sam. I having advanced
the money to pay for said boy Sam. I do hereby confirm
unto my said son David said negro together with their names.

Fifthly I will and bequeath as follows to my son William Lyons,
I had heretofore given him one of the said farms and

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Mitchell
McCluer the farm on which he now ~~lives~~ resides
known as the George Morris farm situate to Center
one hundred & eighty two acres & lying about four
miles west of Rogersville on the main Road And I
require the said Mitchell McCluer to pay one half
of my debts which is charged on this bequest

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son Montgomery
McCluer the tract of land now in his possession
lying about eight miles west of Rogersville on the
main Road it being the same tract of land
conveyed to me by George Bates to which reference
is made for corners & distances & quantity and
I require the said Montgomery McCluer to
pay one half of my debts with which this bequest
is charged

Sixthly I do hereby nominate & appoint my wife
Susannah executrix of this my will without
requiring her to give bond or qualifying
in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
