Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my son John Hicks the sum of One dollar and there is all I intend to give him.

Eighthly, I give unto my son William J. Hicks the sum of One dollar, and there is all I intend to give him.

Ninthly, I give and bequeath to my son James Hicks, the sum of One dollar, and there is all I intend to give him.

Tenthly, I give and bequeath to my son John Hicks the following tract of land lying in Hawkins County in the fourth Civil District, bounded as follows, Beginning on my white oak down three Southwardly up the Spring branch with John Hicks late to Roger line, thence Southwardly with Roger line to William Jenkins line, thence with same Jenkins line, to the beginning. Copy of the last will and testament of Washington McGhee was given by the estate of Alexander Smith & Wm. Price, this 1st day of June 1877.

Whereas I Washington McGhee, of the County of Hawkins and State of Tennessee, have made my last will and testament, in writing, bearing date the 17th day of Oct, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty four, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of the future and transitory life, do therefore make certain public and declare this to be my last will and testament, this is to say, First after all my lawfull debts are paid and discharged the residue of my my estate, I give bequeath and dispose of as follows to wit: To my Brother, A R McGhee for notes of hand amounting to four hundred and fifty nine dollars, fifty three cents which I hold in the said A R McGhee. Also one dollar more.

Second I make constitute and appoint my Brother A R McGhee and H. H. H. H. to be Executors of this my last will and testament, highly trusting all will be by me made, in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this the day above written.

In the name of God, Whom I know, I, William Price of the County of Hawkins and State of Tennessee, being in view the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, and being desirous to dispose of this order goods such as it hath pleased God to entrust me with, I do on the 25th day of August, in the year of our Lord 1876, Make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following to wit:

- 1st I direct my beloved wife, Jane, to pay my debts and funeral expenses out of any money I may have or for coming out her house, and I appoint her executrix of this my will.
- 2nd I give and bequeath to my said wife Jane, during her widowhood all my property, both real and personal, and at her death or the end of her widowhood, I give and bequeath the same to my to be equally divided between them.
