Copy of the last will & testament of W. M. Miller deceased
W. M. Miller being sixty five years of age declared this
to be my will

- 1st I declare that my daughter Matilda has the land I bought
of Ellen Ryan being south of the river & four thousand
dollars in notes or cash.
- 2^d I give to my son Miles all the land east of the creek
including the Saw Garden, Store, half of the Stock Farm
minus half the Island East near Four thousand
dollars in notes or cash, half the stock in the Saw Garden
half the mill.
- 3^d I give to my son Rudolf all the land west of the
Creek including the Prairie Horse plain half the Island
near me & four thousand dollars in notes or money half
the stock in sawing mill, half the stock in Saw Garden
half the mill.
- 4th I give to my daughter Sue half the 500 acres of land
So the River I bought of Joe Miller's estate half the
500 acre entry Palestine Spring place adjoining the
Yellow Branch & four thousand dollars in notes or cash &
a horse
- 5th I give to my daughter Mary half the 500 acre tract south
of the River bought of Joe Miller's estate half the Palestine
Spring sixty 500 acres, four thousand dollars in notes or cash
& a horse

I appoint Willie Miller or Rudolf my executor. Either to administer
with or without Security

The last will & testament of Cornelius G. Groce deceased.

In the name of God Amen. I Cornelius

G. Groce of the County of Washington and State of Tennessee being of
sound mind and disposing memory but somewhat feeble in body do
make and publish this my last will and testament,

- 1st It is my wish and desire that the expenses attending my death and burial
shall be paid out of any money or property that I may
have at the time of my death.
- 2^d I give and bequeath unto my grand son, Andrew Groce all
my lands in Stanley Valley on the waters of Big Creek, Con-
sisting of the head tract containing one hundred and fifty
six acres, also an entry of twenty acres joining the land of
Christian Sumner and others. But reserving the house and kitchen
in, for a homestead for my wife Sarah Groce, which she is
to remain sole proprietor of during her natural life also a
comfortable support from the farm, together with the stock
for the use of the place, and on condition that the said An-
drew Groce dies before he arrives to the age of twenty one, the
aforesaid lands is to descend back to the heirs of said Cor-
nelius G. Groce.
- 3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter Polly ^[linkus] ~~Shanks~~ and her heirs
that portion of my Stanley Valley farm, whereas she now lives and
borders as follows. Beginning on an oak in John Gilliams
line, then running with top of the ridge as said John Gilliams
line, comprising the land north of said line.
- 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Shanks and
her heirs the other portion of said farm, and bounded by
said line at the top of the ridge, made and established
by said Cornelius Groce. Between the said Polly ~~Shanks~~ and
Matilda Shanks, consisting of the land on the south side
of said line.
- 5th To my son Lewis Groce, I give and bequeath out of my
estate one dollar, also to my son James Groce one dollar.
To my grand son Thomas Groce son of Henry Groce I
bequeath one dollar, in the balance of Henry Groce's
children, Sarah, Maria, John and Matilda one dollar
a piece
- 6th It is my wish and desire that my son John Groce shall
have the mill and all the appurtenances, in accordance
with the understanding that he the said John Groce
