

Copy of the last will and testament of William M. Pease
proven 6th day of December 1869.

In the name of God Our Lord, I William Pease
of the County of Franklin and State of Vermont, being
in sound mind and memory clear do here by
do make and publish this my last will and testament
this is to say,

1st I give and bequeath the farm I now live
on, and all my cattle and money and all the han-
dels and Hobbies furniture, and my Stock, to have
and to hold during her natural life and at her death
to be equally divided between my two daughters Martha Jane
and Mary Elizabeth.

2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Jane her
has my lawn place lying at the south side of Chock Man-
tine bearing the name of George M. Pease at the east, and
Streetside Pease at the west, 1 acre and a half, and saddle & cow and
calf.

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Elizabeth all
my pair of Father Cuck, and the rest of that lot also to
be equally divided between my two daughters, one Acre
and saddle & cow and calf.

Copy of Betsy, Martha and Susannah Patterson joint
will, proven 6th day of December 1869.

I Betsy, Martha and Susannah Patterson of
the County of Franklin and State of Vermont, do make
and publish this as my last will and testament hereby re-
voking and making void all other wills by us at any time
time made.

1st We direct that our funeral expenses be paid.

2. I Betsy Patterson wife and bequeath unto Eddy Paterson
the son of Susannah S. Patterson three acres of land,
and Barns etc and below Colt 3 Barns etc, an orchard
Colt, and all of my cattle, and horses and furniture at
my death.

3rd I Martha Patterson, wife and bequeath to Eddy Paterson, the son of Susannah
S. Patterson, all my personal property to have at my death.
4th To S. Susannah S. Patterson wife and bequeath to my son Eddy Paterson all
my personal property.
5th Brother W. Betsy, Martha and Susannah S. Patterson give full provision of
all Stock now in the place, to my son as to have and to have and
Manage as he thinks best.
6th Further the said Eddy Paterson is to support and take care of us, as long
as we may live.
7th And further we are to stay here in the place, as long as we may live.
8th We part of us it is our will and desire that David Patterson the son of
George Patterson, has his Support here in the place, as long as she
may live or remain longer and may stay here as one of the family and
that she be taken care of as long as she may live with us or Eddy
9th We will and bequeath unto Eddy Paterson our lands that we now live
on, the land jointly belongs to us, we Betsy, Martha and Susannah
Patterson, wife and bequeath all our right title and claim that we have
to any tract or parcel of land, as well as the lands we now live on
further the said Eddy Paterson has now full control of said lands to
share and Manage as he thinks best, and is to pay all debts we said
land, and at our death, we will unto Eddy Paterson, the son of Susannah
S. Patterson all of our lands and all our personal property.
10th Further the said Eddy Paterson is to take care and support us, as long as we
may live, further if the said Eddy Paterson should die first, in the
said Betsy, Martha and Susannah S. Patterson is to have and support of
out of said funds, as long as we may live.

Further there is to be known administrator as we have wishes are we have
to Eddy Paterson at our death, Lands and all other property.

Lastly this is our last will as we understand each other don't
as some of us is hard of hearing, Signer in our presence and witness
in our presence. This 8th day of April 1869.
