also to my other two daughters, Manerva Barbara Price, also to
my two sons, A. C. Taylor Price, and Norman Price, my Grandson
Isaac Brooks, to the last legal manner. I give unto my sons and
Grandson each one horse and cow and also a part to
the six last named of equal with the other sons, I also
give unto them each named girls and cows and also
to make them equal with the balance. I know
I make constitute and appoint my said sons

last will and testament, hereby making a full and

that all the remainder of my personal be sold on a credit
of twelve months, and the proceeds thereof be equally divided

and Nancy Malinda.

make public and declare this to be
