

Copy of the Last Will and Testament of William H. Davis deceased
made 5th day of July 1869.

I, William H. Davis of the County of Hancock, State of
Maine, being old and frail of body, but of sound mind, and
desirous of arranging my worldly affairs before I am called
from this world, do hereby make and constitute this my
last will and testament.

First I wish my body decently buried, and my funeral ex-
penses paid out of my property, my executors to have what
they can get.

Secondly - I give my beloved wife Mary to have my home from
during her widowhood or during her natural life. Should
she remain a widow ^{widow} and at her marriage or death
should she remain unmarried she leave to her two chil-
dren - Mrs. Davis and Thomas B. Davis.

Thirdly, I give to my first set of children - Deborah who marries
Lorenzo Edsall, Frances who intermarried with William Smith
her heir & Mary who intermarried with John Naughton
her heirs, Sarah who married Isaac Johnson, Elizabeth
who married Henry Light, Lydia who married Stephen
Haggood who was my daughter of my first wife I give
each fifty ~~dollars~~ acres of land which I own on the
North Side of Church Mountain, and to my son Wilson
I give a receipt which I hold against him for three
hundred dollars, and the land that remains to me after
my daughters get their in my said tract of land
North of the Mountain supposed to be twenty eight
acres or so much as may remain after my said daugh-
ters get their, and I do hereby appoint the persons
my executors of this my last will and testament. In

Seal this 10th day of August 1865.

Copy of the last Will and Testament of Stanley Sigmon deceased
made 2nd day of October 1869.

Stanley Sigmon of the County of
Hancock and State of Maine, considering the uncertainty of mortal life
and being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this
my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit:
to say,

First I give and bequeath to my beloved Sister Mariah Sigmon the following
sum viz: out of estate of lands executed to me by Joseph Sigmon for
the sum of one hundred and twenty ^{on} dollars also one note executed
to me by the said Joseph Sigmon eighty eight dollars to be paid in the same
goods, and I also bequeath to my said Sister Mariah the amount
of monthly pay and bounty that is coming to me for the services
of my son John H. Sigmon who is in the Maine Army, also all the
money he is coming to me as one of the heirs of John Sigmon, who
died in the service of the United States, for his monthly pay and
bounty, and lastly, I want my said Sister Mariah to have all of my
other property that I have, now if then I should be any just
debts, that I owe, I want my said Sister Mariah to pay them out
of the foregoing money, when it comes into her hands. Also I bequeath
that she pay all my brother and sister one dollar each, to wit: viz
my sister Sarah Stapleton daughter of Isaac Sigmon who was the
wife of Robert Chase. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this 2nd day of July 1869.

time declared by him to be his last will and testament, and we at his

Copy of the last Will and Testament of William H. Davis deceased
made 2nd day of August 1869.

Hancock County, Maine.

I, William H. Davis do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby
revoking and making void all other wills by me made at any time
previous to this.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as
soon after my death as possible, out of my money, that I may die
