

Copy of the last will & testament of William Graw  
late pronounced this 3<sup>rd</sup> day November A.D. 1873.

In the name of God Amen,  
I William Graw of the County of Hawkins and State of Tennessee  
Calling to mind that it is appointed unto men  
one to die and bring of same mind and memory are  
willing to dispose of such property estate, as it has pleased  
God to bless me, with, do hereby make and Ordain  
and publish this my last will and testament in  
the words and figures following to wit:

I now 1<sup>st</sup>, I direct that all my just debts and my fu-  
-real expenses be paid out of any money that  
may here come into the hands of my executors  
I now 2<sup>nd</sup> To my wife Rutha I give and bequeath my  
plantation on which I now live, and all my personal  
property of whatever description, of which I may  
die sequester and possessed, for due during her hu-  
-man life or widowhood.

I now 3<sup>rd</sup> At the death or marriage of my wife Rutha  
I direct that all the property herein placed in the hands  
of my said wife, shall be equally divided between  
my children Mrs. Polly Graw, Nancy Graw, the  
Misses Elizabeth, Minerva, Rosaria, Dennis  
Graw, Patty Murrell the heirs of John Graw his  
Orphans Eliza and Rutha Graw, Nancy & heirs.  
also myself, as well, may divide said property proper-  
-ly without sale, otherwise the property shall be  
divided between my said heirs also mention, the  
the names of Daniel Graw was taken out by my  
children, Sterling Graw being indebted to me by him  
to at least the worth of his right share in my  
estate, which said note is for five hundred and  
fifty dollars, due at our day after date, Aug  
1<sup>st</sup> 1861, created Aug 17<sup>th</sup> 1868 with \$120.00 and  
all interest up to the date.

I now 4<sup>th</sup> To Daniel Graw and his heirs, I give and  
bequeath said note above described in kind of also  
their interest, as lies in my estate, both pecuniary and  
real.

I now 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby appoint my trusty friends Elbert

Day & Nicholas Wolfe Executors of this my last will  
and testament, before me and dated this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May  
in the Year of Lord One thousand eight hundred and Sixty  
three,

I, Nancy Graw being of sound mind and mem-  
ory, know in the certainty of death, and the un-  
certainty of life, do make this my last will and  
testament, giving I will to the Almighty God my  
soul who gave it, second my funeral expenses  
to be paid out my estate.

Third I will all my lands to Patti Cooper, during  
her life time, and after her death to be divided  
equally between my two nephews Dennis Graw,  
and George W. Bradshaw.

I will to my niece Somersel Clark fifty dol-  
lars to be paid out at part of the estate I have  
a欠 my Robert Cooper and to Buchanan  
Miles fifty dollars to be paid out of any  
notes which I may have at my death and  
to Stillman Harvey Battiff, fifty dollars to be  
paid from any notes which I may have as  
the above. Also fifty dollars equally divided  
between Mary Newell Grimes Hodges during  
the time I have a sum Esphraun Brown to be  
placed in the hands of Dennis Graw, and  
the interest of said note to be paid annually  
to the Preacher in Charge for the time being  
as Quenitago, and at the death of Dennis  
Graw, the principle of said note to be fifty  
monies and the interest to be perpetually paid  
as before directed to the Preacher of the Metho-  
dist Episcopal Church South, at Elizabethtown  
this 2<sup>nd</sup> day,

I will all the remainder of my property to my

Peter Wells, during her life, and at her death  
I claim from the proceeds of said property  
fifty dollars, to be paid Mrs Wells daughter  
of Ben Wells, and fifty dollars to Rosannah  
Wells.

I hereby appoint Peter Wells my Executor  
to see that this my last will is carried out  
as I have directed, dated this 11 day of Oc-  
tober eighteen hundred and Twenty three,

Copy of the last will and Testament of Thomas Anderson  
dead from 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1873.  
State of Indiana, Marion County;

I Thomas Anderson, being of sound  
mind and perfect memory do make and publish this  
my last will and Testament in manner and form following:  
First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Anderson  
all, all my household and kitchen furniture, to  
gather with our Son Mary during her Natural life.  
Secondly I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy  
Williams, the house when I die including the lot of land  
as has already been dedicated to her.  
Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter-in-law Eliza  
Anderson and her heirs the house when she now  
lives and eight acres of land around said house.  
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Starns  
and her heirs the house when she now lives and eight  
acres of land around said house.  
Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Payne  
and James H. Payne the house when they now live  
and eight acres of land around said house  
during their Natural life. And the remainder  
of my lands to be equally divided between

Nancy Williams, Elizabeth Anderson, and her heirs Elizabeth  
Starns, and her heirs Mary Payne, and James H. Payne and at  
the death of Mary Payne, and James H. Payne, their portion of  
the same to fall back to my heirs heirs.

Sixthly I will and bequeath that all my money stocks and property  
be equally divided between Nancy Williams, Elizabeth Anderson,  
and her heirs, Elizabeth Starns and her heirs, Mary Payne and  
James H. Payne.

I hereby nominate and appoint David R. Anderson my sole  
Executor of this my last will and testament, in witness of  
which I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this  
the 10<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and twenty two.

Copy of the last will and Testament of James S. Phillips was made  
this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1874

I James S. Phillips, of the County of Marion County,  
and State of Indiana, being of sound mind; but growing  
feeble in Strength; Having the uncertainty of Life and  
the certainty of death, do make this my last will and  
Testament revoking and canceling all: I ever did.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> To my son William S. Phillips, I bequeath or will a  
certain tract of land lying on the south side of Notary river,  
in the upper end of Long Bottom is being the same tract of  
land that was deeded by my Father William Phillips begin-  
ning by a Sycamore on the river bank, near the upper end  
of the bottom, thence South 25 East 24 poles to where oak  
tree thus big as fingers on the top of the bluffing at  
sixty of the same, thence South 71 East 16 poles to a hickory  
in the head of a dry hollow, thence South 36 East 104 poles  
to a post oak on the ridge top of the mountain with  
post oak, dogwood and hickory as pointers, thence down  
the south side of the mountain, with a dry hollow south  
36 East 16 poles to a lake, in this basin there is cut
