I May Whiter of the County of Hancock and State of Maine being in full health, but of sound disposing mind and memory, do make this as my last will and testament, hereby making and making void all other wills by me or any here made.

And I direct that my funeral expenses and also my just debts to be paid as soon after my death as practicable out of any moneys I may the executor of, or my executor have into the hands of Executor hereinafter named,

Firstly, I give and devise, to my daughter, Saisiana Sackner, wife of Samuel Sackner, my entire landed estate, embracing the land whereon I now live, I also give and bequeath to my said daughter Saisiana, the following named personal property, to wit; my 24 Beds & Bed Clothing, Sofa, Bed room furniture, household and kitchen furniture of every description, Wagon, Harness, Cows and Calf, also an account in Samuel County for \$9.90 and also an other account in William A. Hilds for thirteen dollars

Secondly I give and bequeath to my Grand Children who live in the State of Indiana the issue of John Whiter, and Elizabeth Whiter, my daughter to wit: Hugh Whiter, Edith Whiter, Susan Whiter, May Whiter, Elizabeth Whiter, Margaret Ann Whiter, Four hundred Dollars Cash, to be paid by Samuel Sackner and wife Saisiana this bequest is in lieu of one half of my tract of land I had intended to give to my said Grand Children who are to share and share alike this said bequest and in lieu is to be by Grant upon said land to secure the payment of the before mentioned four hundred dollars.

Thirdly I hereby nominate and appoint my executor named John D. Haysor Executor of this my last will & testament.

The last will & testament of William A. Hisinger do was given by the Order of John D. Stephens to D. B. Brashers 11th day of October 1875

In the County of Hancock, I William A. Hisinger, of the County of Hancock and State of Maine, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of the future and transitory life, do therefore make, publish, and declare, this to be my last will and testament; that is to say, First, after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give bequeath and dispose of as follows, to wit: My father John A. Hisinger, to have a comfortable support during his natural life, for the purpose of the same.

To William David Hisinger, a son of my wife, I give and bequeath, if he should survive with my family, until he is twenty one years of age, the following property, a contract or promise that I have made to him, to give him a bond of one hundred and thirty dollars (\$100.00) in currency, but should he die before he is twenty one years of age, then I do not give and bequeath anything to the said W. D. Hisinger. The remainder of my property, both real and personal, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Hisinger, the same upon which I now live, adjoining the lands of Joseph Hisinger, David Cox, Solomon Hisinger and Deane Cox, lying and being in Grosvenor Valley, South (7) Civil District, Hancock County, Maine.

Secondly I make constitute and appoint James H. Laws and Joseph H. Halloway, to be my executors of this my last will and testament, hereby making all former wills by me void.
