I also give and bequeath to my said daughter Louisa Maria, the following names of personal property, to wit; my 24 Bed. & Bed. Clothing, Saddle, Harness, table and my household and kitchen furniture, of every description, Wagon, Harness, Cows and Calf, also an account of Samuel Barker for \$9.90 and also the other account of William A. Allen for ten Dollars.

My dear Sir and bequeath to my Grand Children who live in
the State of Indiana the issue of John White, and Elizabeth White,
my daughter to wit: Hugh White, Edith White, James White,
Mary White, Elizabeth White, Margaret Ann White, Four hundred
Dollars Cash, to be given by James McKim and wife James
- this bequest is in lieu of your half of my tract of land,
I had intended to give to my said Grand Children who
are to share and share alike in said bequest, and in lieu is to
be another upon said lands to receive the payment of the
before mentioned Four hundred Dollars.

Lastly, I hereby nominate and appoint my executor friend John D. Mayors
Executor of this my last will & testament.

The last visit & testament of William A. Hungen, the one given by the
Order of John D. Stephens to Dr. B. Brauer on 4th day of October 1845

In the Name of God, Amen, I William S. Munger, of the County of Washington and State of Missouri, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish, and declare, this to be my last will and testament; That is to say, First, after all my lawful debts are paid and discharge, the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, bequeath and dispose of as follows. I will, say I do, that John S. Munger, to have a comfortable support during his natural life from the proceeds of this fund.

• To William David Wilson, a son of my wife, I give and bequeath, of his share or

a Contract or promise, that I have made to him, to give him a bond of \$1000
and order to be worth ten hundred dollars (\$1000⁰⁰) in currency, for himself
(C.D. Wilson), free to stay with my family, and be satisfied with it in twenty one
years old, then I do not give and bequeath anything, to the said C.D. Wilson,
the remainder of my property, both real and personal, I give and bequeath to my
daughter Mary Ann Wilson, the same upon whole I now be assigning
the lands of Joseph Wilson, James A. Wilson, James Wilson and James A. Wilson,
-ing and living in Grovelly Valley South (7) Civil District, Hancock County
Tennessee

likewise I make constitute and appoint Saml M. Law and Joseph Hallen,
to be my Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
all former wills by me made.
