

Will of William Morelock

I, William Morelock do make and publish this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all other by me at any time made.

1st I give and bequeath to my Mother a home for lifetime

2nd I give and bequeath to my Wife Rodia Morelock a home as long as she remains my Widow.

3rd I give and bequeath an equal Interest in my real estate to my children namely: Elven Morelock, Charity Morelock, Sarah Morelock Wife of S. P. Morelock, Jay Morelock, Lea Morelock, Burthea & Morelock.

4th I give and bequeath to my son Elven Morelock a yoke of oxen.

5th I give and bequeath all my personal property to the use of my family. I do to this my will at my hand this 7th day of August 1887. One thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty Seven.

Last Will of Mary Armstrong. Proved July 2, 1888

I, Mary Armstrong, being weak in body, but of sound disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and Testament.

1st I give, bequeath and devise all the real and personal property that I may die seized and possessed of, wherever situated or being, to my two brothers Arthur L. Armstrong and George Armstrong, to be owned, enjoyed and possessed by both of them absolutely so long as they both or either of them shall live and upon the death of one of them, the survivor shall take the moiety or share of the deceased brother, but as long as they both live they shall share and share alike in said real and personal property, as Co-tenants or tenants in Common with the right to enjoy and dispose of same as they may deem proper, subject only to the right of survivorship in so much as may be remaining at the death of whichever of them may die first.

And upon the death of both of said brothers, my will and desire is that whatever part of my property herein devised may remain in specie, shall be converted into money and the proceeds applied to keeping up the family grave yard, and in placing tombstones, or other suitable monuments at the graves of my kindred who are, or may be there buried, and otherwise properly embellishing and taking care of same, so long as the funds will justify said family grave yard is on the farm now owned by James Galbraith in Tazewell Valley in the 7th Civil District of Hawkins County Tennessee.

2nd I hereby nominate and appoint my brother George Armstrong Executor of this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand this April 16th 1888.
