Last Will and Testament of Anderson Lawson

I, Anderson Lawson of the County of Hawkins and State of Tennessee, being of sound disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First I will that my body be decently buried in a manner to suit my condition in life, and that my funeral expenses be paid out of any money that I may die seized and possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my executors and that all my just debts be paid.

Secondly I will and that my wife Anna have the home place where we now live with all the stock of every kind and all of household and kitchen furniture.

Thirdly I will that my two small daughters Susan and Betty now living with me have one dress, one bonnet and one pair of good flannel and one pair of good clothing - each.

Fourthly I will that my grandson Vernon Anderson Lawson have the land where he now lives.

Fifthly I will that my daughter Harriet Marshall (wife of Joseph Marshall) have all my land where I now live, both my own and my wife Anna's death.

Sixthly I will that all the balance of my property of every kind (if any) after the death of myself and my wife Anna, be equally divided between my daughter Harriet, my Grand daughter Anna and Betty and my Grandson Anderson Lawson, in witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 7th day of August 1880.
