Wick R, a Negro woman named Maria, a girl named
Peggy that being lot No 1. valued by us to fourteen
hundred and fifty dollars (the agreeing to take that
lot and the parties consenting). Allotted to William
Sankford a negro man named Jubilee, a negro
woman named Rachel and her Child Mary.
that being lot No 2. valued by us to fifteen hundred
dollars. Allotted to Peter Sankford a negro
woman Artha, a negro girl named Sally, and
a Negro Boy named George that being lot No 3.
valued by us at eleven hundred & fifty dollars.
Allotted to Nicholas Sankford a Negro man
named Harry, a negro girl named Martha, and a
Boy named Aaron. that being lot No 4. Valued
by us to fifteen hundred dollars. Allotted to
John Sankford a Negro woman named Chaney,
a negro girl named Judy and a Negro Boy named
Pleasant that being lot No 5. valued by us to
fifteen hundred dollars. We also Charge lots
Nos 2. 4 & 5. with eighty seven dollars & fifty cents
each to be paid to lot No 3. that being Peter Sankford
