We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Haywood, at the March Term of said Court 1838. to divide the Slaves belonging to the Estate of the late William Christian dec'd. among the several Legates, report that we have met pursuant to said Order, and find the number of Slaves to be five, to wit: Washington aged 23. valued at 740 dollars, Billy aged 21. valued at 570 dollars, Sarah aged 43. valued at 215 dollars, Edy aged 19. valued at 540 dollars, Maria aged 2 years valued at 185 dollars, making the total amount 2280 dollars, We find also that there are nine Legates to wit; Mrs Harriet Bratton, Jas. H. Christian, John A. Christian, John W. Watson, James Scott, N.S. Elizabeth Christian, Isabella Christian, Anderson Killen and Gilbert Christian; and that the part of each Legate is two hundred and fifty three dollars & 33 1/3 cents.

We have proceeded to divide said Slaves among said Legates, by lot as follows. Mrs Harriet Bratton drew Washington - Mrs Elizabeth Christian drew Billy - Mrs Isabella Christian drew Sarah - Anderson Killen drew Edy - Gilbert Christian drew Maria -

All of which is respectfully submitted to the Honorable Court.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary and Children all my Negroes to be kept together by her, for her and their support and the education of the Children, during her widow hood or until my ~~eldest~~ Son arrives at the age of twenty one years, or my daughter Nancy marries, and in the event she should marry before she arrives at full age, then an equal portion of my property then existing and not heretofore devised, be allotted off to him or her and to his or her heirs and assigns forever. I also will & desire that if my wife should marry, that an equal portion or child's part of my property not heretofore devised be allotted off to her, her heirs and assigns forever, and also as the balance of my children may severally arrive at lawful age

It is my will and desire that an equal portion with the first that may be allotted off or distributed, be allotted off and given to each and their heirs and assigns forever. I also will and desire that should my wife not marry until my youngest child ~~deceases~~ ^{deceases} proportional part with the first, that should there be an overplus, then such overplus or part as may then remain to be equally divided between the Children, and to be given to them severally and to their heirs and assigns forever, and be it known that I wish it expressly understood that in the allotments or distributions, the first allotment to be made out of the property that may exist at the time of making it, and all the other distributions to be made of the same value as the first, and all shall receive as much as the first, then the overplus if any to be distributed as above specified.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary H.
