In the name of God, Amen, I, Gideon Jones being of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner & form as followeth: First of all, I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth F. Jones the following property & negroes: Old Moses, Abram, Mary, Allen, Samuel Rachel and Alay, four head of horses, six cows & calves, all of my stock of hogs, sheep, household and kitchen furniture, plows, hoes, axes, & waggon. Item—I give my daughter Martha, Bridget, Charity, Frank, Minty & Betty. Item—I give my daughter Sarah, Phillis, Sophia, Eliak, Hannah, Anthony & Chury. Item—I give my daughter Frances, Margaret, Mary, Ernes, Jonah, Lucy, Liza, & Abram. Item—I give my daughter Maria, Ester, Juthay, Famer, Moses, Jack, Big Betty & Park. Item—I give my son Asa, Liser and Samuel, John, Mary, Leffin, David & Betsey. It, I give daughter Liser, Lody, Lige, Sam, Henry, Mary, David & Peter. I also give my son Asa the tract of land I bought of Clemon, eight hundred & eighty-five acres. The balance of my property will be sold to pay my debts, the balance of my lands and property will be sold or divided equally with all my heirs. I constitute and ordain my wife Elizabeth and my friend George Cooper, the sole Executors of this my last will and testament, September 19, 1836. Signed, sealed & published, pronounced & declared by the said Gideon Jones as his last will & testament in presence of us who in his presence & in the presence of each other have herunto subscribed our names.

I, Elizabeth Marr, now of the County of Haywood and State of Tennessee, being of sound & disposing mind, and being mindful of the uncertainty of life and anxious to dispose of all my worldly goods and chattels, rights & credits, do make and ordain this my last will hereby revoking all others. In the following manner, to wit: First—I will and devise unto my two sons John Marr and Isaac Marr all my interest in my father's (Col. Ambrose Mucker) estate in Amherst County, State of Virginia, for which there is a suit now depending in the Chancery Court of said Amherst County, to be equally divided between them. Second—It is my wish and desire that the said John & Isaac M. are hereby required, in consideration of the said devise above made to them, that they will and shall decently and comfortably support my daughter Frances J. We, the undersigned Commissioners appointed at the late December term of Haywood County, Court to divide the negroes belonging to the late James Armstrong, dec'd, among the heirs of said Armstrong & report, to wit: having been duly qualified according to law do make the following report, to wit: Pursuant to the object in view, we proceeded to ascertain what advancements, (if any) had been made by the said James Armstrong to the children of said

Armstrong, and ascertained from the best evidence we could procure, that she said Armstrong had given or advanced to his son John Armstrong, dec'd., (now represented by three children, Hervey, Evelina & Mary) in his lifetime a tract of land worth \$1400 and a boy named Isaac 8 years old in 1820 at \$250, making said advancement \$1650. To his daughter Margaret at her intermarriage with Thomas L. Gray as follows: viz; a negro boy 7 years old in 1821 at \$250, and girl not very healthy 5 years old at \$150, making \$400; to his daughter Jane at her intermarriage with William Clark in 1833, as follows: one negro man 22 years old at \$550, one woman not very healthy 22 years old at \$375, and one girl child not healthy 5 years old at \$200, one girl do healthy 3 years old at \$175, making \$1300.

We then valued the balance of or those negroes in possession of James Armstrong, dec'd. at his death as follows: Abraham \$500, Sterling \$625, Lee at \$600, George \$750, Dan \$750, Lindy \$800, Nancy and child \$650, Frances \$350, Frank and child Jeff \$750, Thally & child \$325, Aggy \$500, and finding that John Armstrong had received an advancement

of \$1250, more than Margaret the child of said Armstrong and now the wife of said Thomas L. Gray. We allotted to the said Gray, negro man Abraham \$500, a negro man George \$750, making \$1250, and we also find that Jane, one of the children of of said James Armstrong & now the wife of Wm. Clark, has received \$350, less than the said John Armstrong. We allotted to the said Wm. Clark the negro woman Frances \$350, and thereby have made each share equal, amounting each to \$1650, the value received heretofore, as an advancement to Jno. Armstrong. And do further find that according to the above valuation of the negroes remaining to be divided since the advancement and made equal, that the total amounts to \$4800, which divided into three parts, viz. to the children of John Armstrong, dec'd., Thomas L. Gray and William Clark in right and behalf of their wives give to each in value \$1600, and therefore the following lots were formed according to value:

 Lot No. 3, amounting to \$1675 fell to the heirs or children (viz); Hervey, Evelina, & Mary Armstrong of said John Armstrong son of said James Armstrong, both dec'd. and No. 3 is to pay Lot No. 2 the sum of fifty dollars. Taliaferro of the County of Haywood and State of Tennessee being in such a state of health as to render it doubtless that a desolution of this mortal part must take place in a very short time do make and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others, in manner and form following, to wit:

In the first it is my wish that the growing crop now on hand shall be finished and the cotton crop, and such other perishable as I may possess at my death, not including the present growing crop of corn & fodder which is to be reserved for the use and support of my wife and her family to consist of herself and son Garland & Robert if she should so choose, and probably my daughter Susan, and not herein specifically devised to be sold in such manner and on such terms as my executors yet to be named may think proper and from the proceeds, etc., of said sale all my just debts paid, and the balance (if any), to be laid out in improvements for my wife and son Garland's accommodation on a tract of land which I wish shall be purchased for him my son Garland.

In the second place it is my wish, will and desire and hereby will and bequeath to my wife Louisa the four following negroes, to wit: Hannah, Mary, Ruth and George the younger, my riding horse Jack and three other horses, namely, one a gray named Charles, a bay horse named Roebuck and one filly two years old, the carriage or buggy & harness, the entire growing crop of corn & fodder, and all my stock of every description, one yoke of Oxen & saddles, two plows and sets of gear, two pole axes & six hoes.

It is my will that my wife and family of the members already named shall remain in the possession of the premises, I now occupy and reside upon untill January in the year of our Lord 1839, in order that my son Garland may go to school at least two sessions, and in order too, that in the meantime provision may be made for his and mother's accommodation thereafter as it is my most anx-

ious wish that they shall live and remain together during their joint lives. The property so devised to her to be for and during her natural life and then to go as herein after devised. In the third place I will & bequeath to my son John Edwin my negro woman Rainey, and the sum of eleven hundred dollars in money from the proceeds of the sale of my lands in Virginia to him & his heirs forever.

Having heretofore given to my daughter Julia five negroes and a lot in Brownsville with other things not necessary here to name I shall devise nothing to her.

I will and hereby give and bequeath unto my son Charles P. the tract of land on which I at present reside containing fifty-five acres with all its appurtenances, etc., my negro man George and after the death of my wife, my negro woman Mary to him and his heirs forever.

I further will and bequeath to my daughter Susan R. the five following named negroes, to-wit: Peggy, Salley, Emily, Henry and Lucy, and my tract of land purchased of Samuel Oldham adjoining Brownsville containing thirty-one acres, and during her soleacy or single state, and in the event of her marriage and her mother's approval thereof, then to her and her heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath to my son Robert S. the following named negroes, to wit: Nancy, Susan and Addiline and at his mother's death the negro boy Rush and the one-half of the proceeds of the sale of the tract of land purchased of Samuel Dickens to him and his heirs forever.

Page 242.

I give and bequeath to my son Garland my three negroes, to wit: Booker, Tennessee & her child Amanda and at his mother's death the negro woman Hannah and the land herein directed to be purchased for him, by my executors, to him & to his heirs forever.

It is my will and desire that my wife shall give to whomsoever she may choose the negro boy George herein before devised to her, either in her last will and testament or otherwise, as she may think proper.

It is my will and direction to my executors and they are hereby empowered and authorized, as soon as may be convenient after my death to sell the tract of land purchased of Samuel Dickens on credit, if necessary and the proceeds, in two equal portions laid out in two tracts of land, the one for my son Robert S. and the other for my son Garland in some other neighborhood.

It is my further will and desire and so bequeath and devise that all the negroes herein devised to my two sons Robert S. and Garland shall be and remain in the possession of my wife for the joint use, support and benefit of her and the said Robert S. & Garland until each of said boys shall arrive at the age of twenty-one years and as each shall attain that age he shall receive the negroes herein devised to him. In relation to the devise of the fifty-five acre tract of land to my son Charles P., I have further to will, that he shall at any time after my death have the control of said land, timber, etc., without restraint, save the houses, which are to be occupied by my wife as aforesaid.

In the name of God, Amen, I, Maslin Bass, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for man once to die, do make and ordain this as my last will and testament. As it has pleased Providence to bestow what I have I wish to dispose of it in the following manner, to wit: In the first place I have made my wife Sarah, a deed of gift for all that I wish her to have, which is recorded in Halifax, N. Carolina, which provides for her life and afterwards to go to my daughter M. F. M. A.

Since the gift there has been a negro woman sold by the name of Kitty Fisher. I now give them a negro girl by the name of Mary in lieu of Kitty, if they think proper to take her, which is all that I intend, as

my wife's conduct has been so very extraordinary to me; my child is also provided for by the will of her grandmother, de'd.
 Item 2nd My daughter Sarah Heath of Virga. I give ten dollars. It is not for the lack of affection that I give her no more, but because that she is sufficiently provided for by the will of her uncle David Watson, de'd. I think they have plenty,
 Item 3rd My daughter Maria Willis I have give, I think, their full share; they must be satisfied.
 Item 4th My daughter Nancy W. Hall I give four negroes, to wit: Milly & child George, girl Melissa and a boy by the name of Nathan, on their giving up their claim as heir to my son George, de'd.

Item 5th My son Henry A. I give a negro girl Eliza in addition to what I have before given him. I also wish him to have the residue of money after settling my son George's estate.

Item 6th My daughter, R. Jane, I give a negro girl Sally.

Item 7th My daughter Julia Loftin I give a negro woman Eliza upon their paying R. Jane & Susan each twenty-five dollars for the difference in value of negroes.

Item 8th My daughter Susan L. I give a negro girl Lewis.

The residue of my negroes not given away with their increase, I wish to be annually hired out from year to year and all my perishable property sold by my executors hereafter named and the monies arising from the sale and hires to be yearly accounted for amongst R. Jane, Julia Loftin & Susan L., provided they give up their claim to my son George's estate. My object in this proviso is to prevent any more of my negroes being sold. I do nominate and appoint my daughters Jane and Susan L., Executors to this my last will and testament so long as they shall faithfully discharge their trust, but should they fail I hope they may be called upon by the Honorable Court of Haywood County to give security for a discharge of duty or the estate taken from them.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date first written.
