In the name of God Amen:

I Edward Williams of the County of Haywood & State of Tennessee, being minded of death, knowing that is certain & life uncertain & life uncertain, now of sound mind & memory but in a weak and sickly state of health, do on this eighth day of July in year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred & thirty-five, make, ordain, constitute and appoint this instrument of writing my last will & Testament, in manner & form following, to wit:
First-I give and recommend my immortal soul to Almighty God who gave it. Next

I give my body to the dust of the earth to be immediately (after death), decently interred at discretion of my surviving friends. As to what worldly property God in his providence has been pleased to put into my possession; I give & bequeath to my loving wife during her natural life, one hundred acres of land, including the house where I now live, and about twenty six acres of cleared land, beginning on my east boundary line at a point so that running west will be on the first fence north of the lane. Then with said fence to the first fence running north & south; thence south to the first apple tree row, thence with said row to the river, likewise I give to my wife forever my negro woman named Kizza & what increase she may have after my death, also two beds & furniture, three head of cattle her choice, and as many cows & pigs as she may choose, a sorrel horse named Tom, all the kitchen furniture (except two large kettles), which is only for life; also one plough & harness. During her natural life and that only, my negro man named Daniel & two boys named James & Alfred. As to my son Edward previous to this date I have given all that I thought my duty required me to give him. My daughter Elizabeth I have given all except a note given by Peter Sugg to me which note I give her the benefit of.

My son John in addition to what I have already given him I give him one of the kettles above mentioned; likewise a bay filly & her increase (after the death of my wife). My son Seth the whole of the land that I am now in possession of, and one of the above mentioned kettles. My daughter Mincey Mitchell, I give all she has now in possession. But to her son Columbus Greene Mitchell, I give (after the death of my wife), my negro boy Alfred. Likewise (after the death of my wife) I give my daughter Mincey Mitchell my negro man Daniel. My negro boy James (after the death of my wife), I give to my son John's son Jesse. My daughter Nancy Crawford I give all she has in possession and all of that may arise from the proceeds of a sale of what property I have hereby not bequeathed after paying all my just debts.

I do hereby constitute, nominate & appoint my son Edward Williams my sole Executor & I do enjoin it on him conjunctly & religiously to execute this my last will & testament according to the true intent of meaning thereof.

following, that is, I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it came in hope of a glorious resurrection through the merits of Jesus Christ. And as to my worldly goods that it has pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of as follows, to wit: I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth the whole of my estate, both real and personal during her natural life, or widowhood.

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my children William Samuel Maisey (the wife of Isaac Croome) and Owen in addition to the property heretofore given them, the sum of fifty cents each.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my son Michael twenty-seven dollars at the death of his mother.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy, wife of Joel Campbell, one cow & calf, one bed, bedstead and furniture, which I now deliver.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son Noah one half of my land and one-third of my personal estate after the death of my wife.

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my son James the other half of my land and one-third of my personal estate after the death or widowhood of my wife. If either my sons Noah or James should die it is my will that the other should inherit the land.

Page 345. Item 6th.

I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth my sole executrix to this my last will & testament and do authorize her further, should she become disqualified, to sell any lands above given to my sons Noah & James and appropriate the monies arising therefrom to the purchase of land to be divided as before mentioned between my two sons Noah and James. Furthermore, if she thinks proper to give my son Michael something more of my personal estate, it is my wish she should do so.

Item 7th. I give and bequeath unto the children of my son William, one white horse, one heifer, and nineteen head of hogs, which property I purchased under execution and left in his possession.
