I William McJones of the County of Wayne and State of Tennessee, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking, and making void all other Wills by me at any time ~~heretofore~~ made. First, I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible, out of any moneys that I may die possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my executor. Secondly, I direct that my ~~Store~~ or stock of goods that may be on hand at my death all to be sold to pay my debts on to the Cash, and I leave it all ^{in the power} to my executor to sell as he may think best and proper, and I direct my executor to sell or rent out my Store house and lot my Store is now on on as he may see fit or may think best and proper, and after all my just debts is paid, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza R. and my beloved daughter Sarah Jones all the balance and residue of my property real and personal to be equally divided between the two, to them and their heirs forever, lastly I William McJones do hereby nominate and appoint my friend George Cooper my executor to this my last Will and testament. The Last will & Testament of John Hargrove.

I John Hargrove of the County of Waynes and State of Tennessee, do make, Ordain and establish this instrument of writing as my last will and Testament, namely:

First it is my wish and desire and so will that all my just debts shall be paid.

Second it is my will and desire and so I devise and bequeath that my tract of land containing seventy five acres more or less whereon I now reside together with the following named negroes, to wit; Wellington, Matilda and Henry together with all my other property of every kind and description whatever be equally divided share and share alike among all my children, namely, Salina A. Fortune wife of Jos. B. Fortune, Pamela B. Hargrove, Emily Ann Hargrove, Susan Jane Hargrove, Isabella Hargrove, Thomas P. Hargrove, Alexander Hargrove, Mary C. Hargrove and Ann Maria Hargrove but that said division shall not take place untill the lapse of five years after this my last will & Testament shall be admitted to probat according to law in such cases: nor shall each or any of my children have or be considered to have under this will or otherwise, a vested estate, right or title in any of my said Estate at any time before the expiration of the said five years my said Estate is to be kept together.

Third it is my wish and desire and I do bequeath and devise, that in as much as my Son-in-law John B. Fortune and myself are Cropping together this year on equal parts, and raising stock, horses, hogs and cows upon the same terms, that he the said John B. Fortune

shall have half of all the Crops of every kind and description including Vegetables, and half the horses, hogs and cows now in my possession upon my plantation laid off to him at any time after my decease that may be most convenient & suitable, by two disinterested men the one to be selected by my executor herein after named, and the other by the said Jos. B. Fortune: and in case they of their disagreement, to select a third person themselves.

Lastly I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friend Samuel Harris my sole executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others, and as I have full confidence in his capacity and integrity it is my express declaration that he shall not be required to give bond and security, before taking out letters testamentary upon my said estate.

In the name of God amen. I John Marr of the County of Waycross and State of Tennessee, being old and afflicted, but of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament (heretby revoking) all others by me heretofore made in manner and form following.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Marr one hundred and fifty acres of land to be laid off to her out of two tracts of land, one that I purchased of Daniel Cherry and the other of Daniel Spadding, the said one hundred and fifty acres to be laid off where the Cherry tract crosses on Benjamin Ruckers land where he now lives.

I also give and bequeath unto my said beloved wife Sarah the following negro Slaves, viz; Joshua and his wife Ciccy, Amanda, Ludy, Patrick, Lewis, Willey, Gray, Bartlett, Amy & Fanny, I do will and bequeath to my said wife Sarah my Wagon and gear, and four horses; also my entire Stock of Cattle and hogs, farming utensils, house hold and Kitchen furniture. It is my will and pleasure that my beloved wife Sarah during her life to make use of the above mentioned property as she thinks best, and at her death to dispose of the same as she may think proper.

I also ^{will} bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Morris and her heirs (wife of Carter Morris) the following named negro Slaves, to her and her heirs forever.

I also will and bequeath unto my son James Marr one hundred and twenty five acres of land to be laid off out of the land I purchased of Daniel Spadding & James Ryer, twenty nine acres out of the Ryer tract, and the balance of

ninety six acres out of the Spadding tract and be adjoining, also the following negro Slaves, viz; Mills, Nancy & Betty.

I also will and bequeath unto my son Ambrose Marr ~~one hundred and twenty five acres of land~~ to be laid off to him out of the tract I purchased of Daniel Spadding to include the place whereon he now lives to him and his heirs forever, also the following negro Slaves viz; Williard, Myatt & Sarah.

I also will and bequeath unto my son John Marr two hundred acres of land to be laid off out of the tract of land I purchased of James Ryer and to include the place whereon Lee W Rucker formerly lived a base also the following negro Slaves viz; Jamett & Caleb.

I also will and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Rucker (wife of Ambrose Rucker) one hundred acres of land to be laid off out of the tract of land I purchased of Daniel Cherry, and to include the place and farm whereon the said Ambrose Rucker now lives. Also the following negro Slaves, viz; Anna, Mary & Anthony to her and her heirs forever and for no other purpose.

I also will and bequeath to my son Alexander Marr one hundred & twenty five acres of land to be laid off to him out of the tract of land I purchased of Blackman Coleman lying on the North side of Forked Deer river, also the following negro Slaves, viz; Harry, George & Lucy.

I also will and bequeath to my son John Marr in trust for my Daughter Susanah Sloan, (wife of William Sloan,) one hundred acres of land, to her and her heirs forever, to be laid off to her out of the tract of land I purchased of Daniel Spadding, also the following

Negro Slaves, viz; Licy, Judy, Archy, & Emily, in trust to the said John Starr for the sole use and benefit of my said daughter Sudannah Sloan and the heirs of her body forever.

I also will and bequeath unto my son William R. Starr one hundred and twenty five acres of land it being the one half of the two hundred and fifty acres I purchased of Blackman Coleman, lying north of the Forked Bear River, also the following Negro Slaves viz; Peter, Ben & Schuyler.

I also will and bequeath to my son James Starr in trust for my daughter Sarah R. Starr, one hundred acres of land to be laid off to her out of the tract of land I purchased of Daniel Spadling, also the following Negro Slaves, viz; Sonamah, Selphy and her child Louiza and Stephen.

It is further my will and desire that if my said children cannot agree upon the division of the lands I have herein bequeathed unto them, then and in that event it is my wish that the County Court of Haywood County, do appoint three suitable persons to make the division line.

And it is further my will that my executors which are to be hereafter mentioned, to dispose of my present crop of Cotton &c and from the proceeds pay all of my just debts, should there not be enough to pay them off, they are authorized and required to hire out such of my before mentioned negro slaves as shall be sufficient to create a fund for that purpose, and before any one of my heirs are permitted to receive any part of the before mentioned ^{bequeathed} negro slaves.

And lastly I do hereby constitute, nominate

and appoint my two sons James R. Starr & John Starr, Executors of this my last will and testament.

The Last Will & Testament of John Chilton

Known all men by these presents that I John Chilton of Haywood County in the State of Tennessee, taking into Consideration the extreme uncertainty of human life, do hereby ordain constitute and appoint the following to be my last will and testament.

1st I give and bequeath to my dear wife Rebecca Chilton an estate during her natural life to all that portion of my land in Haywood County which was purchased from Doctor William Howell, and all that portion of land which I purchased of David Way Esq., which tracts lie contiguous and adjoining each other.

2nd I hereby ratify and confirm to her the use and benefit (during her natural life) of all the Slaves which belonged to her at the time of our marriage, and which have all been heretofore secured to her by a deed in trust to Henry Johnson, and which said Slaves according to the tenor of said deed in trust will upon the death of this testator and his said wife go to her as at law of this testator.

3rd I hereby give and bequeath to the said Rebecca all my stock of Cattle, horses, hogs and sheep, and all my furniture of every description, all my farming utensils and crop which may be growing, or unsold at the time of my decease, all my household and kitchen furniture of every description, all my notes, Bonds or Choses in action, hereby charging the bequest made in this 3rd article with the payment of all my outstanding debts.

4th I hereby give and bequeath to my infant son John Claudel Chilton a tract of land in Haywood County which I lately purchased of Elijah Raynor, and which is commonly known as the Raynor tract.

5th I hereby give and bequeath to my said son John Chilton all my lands which lie in Overton County

in the State of Tennessee, to be disposed of as hereafter provided. 6th I give and bequeath to my said son my negroes Edney and her Child William with all of her issue born after the date hereof, Adaline all her issue born after the date hereof and my boy Stephen.

7th I hereby give and bequeath to my said son John Claudel Chilton the remainder in fee simple, after the death of his mother, to the lands and real estate hereby secured to her during her natural life, that is to say, the place on which I now reside, purchased of Doctor William Howell, and the tract of land purchased of David Way Esq. and which together ~~constitute~~ make our homestead, commonly known to us by the name of Sweet home.

8th I hereby ratify and confirm to my ^{said} son after the death of his mother, all the Slaves which belonged to the mother at the time of my marriage with her, (that is to say, Daniel, Resiah, fat Mary, Elymas, Lempsy, Perdicus, Mary, Perry & Henry, and Lamenia, with the increase of the females now born or hereafter to be born, which said Slaves are secured to my said wife during her natural life, and at her death to my lawful heirs, by a deed in trust heretofore executed to Henry Johnson for that purpose.

9th I hereby give and bequeath to my said son John Claudel Chilton all the Slaves and other property which would fall to me from my father's estate if I should survive him my said father, placing my said son in the same relation to his grandfather which I now occupy so far as it is in my power to do so.

10th Should I have other lawful issue at the time of my decease besides my said son, or should I have a posthumous Child, then all my Children are to be equal sharers in the estate and legacies hereby before given to my said son.
