12th I hereby give and bequeath to the Right Reverend James Henry Otley Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Diocese of Tennessee, and Canonical Successors in office, one acre or seventy ^{four} square yards of land in South West corner of the tract of land, purchased from Doctor William Hoynale, and conveyed by the said Howell to me, which said acre of land is hereby set apart for a Church yard and burying ground, and given to said Bishop and his Canonical Successors, in trust as a Church yard and burying ground for the Protestant Episcopal ^{Parish} Church of Leon Church Brownsville, or any other parish which may be hereafter laid off which shall embrace the said acre of land within its Canonical bounds.

13th I hereby appoint my brother-in-law and friend Henry Robinson of Haywood County in the aforesaid State of Tennessee, my executor to carry into effect this my last will and testament, and the Codicil or Codicils hereafter added as time and Circumstances may hereafter make it necessary.

Non Captive will of Abalom Rudd

We the undersigned Nathaniel and Frederick Wells of the County of Haywood and State of Tennessee do state that the last will and testament of Abalom Rudd was made by him on the 25th day of August 1840 in our presence to which we were specially required to bear witness by testator himself in the presence of each other, and it was made in his last sickness in his own habitation, or dwelling house, where he had been resident ten days at least, and the same is as follows, to wit,

It was his will and desire that his effects should be disposed of at his decease in following manner first, pay me just debts out of the first moneys that come to hand, the balance, to wit, one negro Girl Fanny about twelve years old, also after selling a sufficient quantity of the perishable property to pay to pay his just debts, then the balance to go to his wife Nancy Rudd & Children, to wit, Manerva, Bramley C. Gordon, Jane & Harriet, and if my wife Nancy Rudd should bring forth another child within nine months after my death, it to have a proportionable part with the rest of the above named heirs. One hundred and three acres of land, being more or less. I leave the above land to my wife and Children, and if Lemuel Rudd should sell his land I wish him to sell mine with it, and proceeds of said land given to my wife and Children above named, to be under the control of my wife, and her to give it off to my Children as she may think proper as they become of age.
