In the name of God Amen. I Benj. W Hargett of the State of Tennessee and County Haywood, being of sound mind and memory, blessed be God, do this thirty first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine, make and publish this my last Will and testament in manner following, that is to say, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hargett, the land and plantation on which I now live, including David Wilson's lease at the expiration of his term with all my stock of horses, cattle, hogs and sheep, during her natural life or widowhood, it is my will and desire that should be as much of the above property sold as will pay all my just debts, and that of such property as she my wife thinks she can best spare, I also give and bequeath unto my wife all my Crop of Corn, Cotton & Potatoes.

Unless she my wife should think that she can pay, then debts other ways, as I expect there is some money coming to me from North Carolina, and if she should get that I wish her to pay off the debts with it, and the balance apply to her own use if married.

I also give to my wife Elizabeth Hargett all of my household and kitchen furniture and all of tools of every description during her natural life or widowhood.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Penelope Swann one dollar to be paid to her in money out the property above named. Locke, Charles Fisher & my son John Beard, Executors of this my last will and Testament, revoking all other will or Wills, and I do give to my said Executors all the residue of my estate, both real, & personal, not named in this my last Will and Testament, to be disposed of in whatever manner, or way they may think most advisable for the speedy payment of all the debts, which I owe, and do by these presents

authorize and empower my said Executors to sell and make good titles to all such of the Estate they may sell, and should any of my Estate be left after all my debts are paid, the surplus, to be equally divided between my said Executors Messrs. A.
