I give him full authority to do so, I wish him to arrange and pay all of my just debts, my Int. that I hold in Mercantile houses say Brownsville, Lanefield & our Commission houses below, Orleans, I wish him to Continue as usual if he thinks proper, leaving it all at his discretion to Continue business at each place for the term of six years, or to Close at each or every place as he may think proper, myself & my Brother R. Boyd whom I here appoint my Executors, have been in business for a great many years, & again to be better understood I wish him to have the perfect Control of my Estate, selling any part at his own pleasure, Collecting moneys & disposing of them in any way that he may think best for my interest, My said Executor shall not be required to give security in any way and manner, and when the six years shall have expired from my death the said Robert Boyd Can then have 12 months then Close and settle any business

Poplins on the Town line, near the Academy, being a corner of one hundred acres of land laid off out of my tract for Leonard Cropper, now belongs to Moses Locker, running then North thirty chains to a stake, then West in a stake, on Macay's line, then South to a heap of stones, a corner to my land of the Town land, the East to the beginning. - I also give to my Daughter Christina thirteen acres of land conveyed to me by Capt John Brethton, being part of the town land, running along the Town Chequers towards the Academy, lot N<sup>o</sup> 81 & 89. - I also give to my Daughter Christina, after the death of my wife Susanon, my half lot N<sup>o</sup> 9 and the whole of lot N<sup>o</sup> 10 whenever I now live, with all the improvements thereon, being in the north square of the Town of Galibury, I have already given her a piano Forte & Comode. - I also give to my said Daughter Christina, my Negroes, Jim, - Maniah his wife & increase - Silvia & Fitz she already has got. - I also give to my Daughter

The North prong of the river, to a stake on Garbrough's line of the old ferry tract, then south crossing the big island and South prong of the river along Garbrough's line to the beginning. This includes parts of several tracts and two hundred and fifty three acres, called Horak's tract, I bid the right to said land of Daniel Gary wife and paid them five hundred dollars, it is now in dispute & a suit in Equity, against Garbrough's heirs and others, should a decree be given in my favour, perhaps there will be a sum of Money decreed for me to pay, if so I do give the benefit of the five hundred dollars which I have paid, and what I have paid to Attorneys, to my said Daughter Mary, she paying all further sum or sums of money in obtaining a right. - I also give to my Daughter Mary Locke, my Negroes, Harry, George Locke & called African Tom, Jan, Venus, & Levi. She already has got all the foregoing Estate as mentioned, given to my Daughter Mary, I do to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Christina Fisher, the wife of Charles Fisher, my land to be laid off as follows. Viz. Beginning at a black oak, the same corner where the land begins, I have given in the foregoing item, left to my Daughter Mary, running west with the same line, then North, then West to the corner stake, on the line of Henry Gustave McCulloch's large Manseer tract, now my line of the Walnut ridge tract, near John Adams's corner, then past with the old line & past with Adams's line south crossing Crane Creek to a post oak,

corner to Broomers & Wallens old tract, then East by chs a Hickory, North 36 chs a BC, East by chs & 20 links a stake, North to a post oak, E 59 chs a Hickory, North 36 chs a BC E 5 chs & 50 links a stake, North to the beginning, this includes the whole of Broomers and Martin's tracts, and a small piece, about 10 chs wide between Broomers old tract & Adams's, being a part of the Walnut ridge tract. - I also give to my said Daughter Christina a part of my meadow tract, of land joining the Townland of Calibury - Macays & others. Beginning at two B.C. saplings on the Town line, near the Academy, being a corner of one hundred acres of land laid off out of my tract for Leonard Proser, now belongs to Moses Locker, running then North thirty chains to a stone then West to a stake, on Macays line, then South to a heap of stones, a corner to my land of the Town land, the East to the beginning. - I also give to my Daughter Christina thirteen acres of land conveyed to me by Capt John Frutton, being part of the Town land, running along the Town Chequers towards the Academy, lot N<sup>o</sup> 81 & 89. - I also give to my Daughter Christina, after the death of my wife Deborah my half lot N<sup>o</sup> 9 and the whole of lot N<sup>o</sup> 10 where I now live, with all the improvements thereon, being in the north square of the Town of Calibury, I have already given her a piano Forte & Comode. - I also give to my said Daughter Christina, my Negroes, Jim, - Kishiah his wife & increase Silvia & Fitz, she already has got. - I also give to my Daughter

Christiana the following, named Negroes, in addition, to what she already has got, African Jack, Pompey, his wife, Moses & Youngest child African Bob, all the foregoing Estate as mentioned given to my daughter Christiana, I give to her, & her heirs & assigns forever—

I give and bequeath to my son John, one death & book case, my horse clock, my large Mahogany bedstead, bed & furniture, my Mahogany tables, but to remain in the house during the lifetime of my wife Susanna— I also give to my son John after the death of my wife Susanna, the balance of my meadow tract of land near Sawon after running off the part I have given to my daughter Christiana, her part to be taken off the upper end of the tract of land— I also give to my son John four lots Nos 33, 34, 41 & 42 and the pasture back of the old schoolhouse & grave yard— I also give and bequeath to my son John, four hundred acres of land on the east side of the river Gadkin, beginning at a hickory standing on the east bank of the Gadkin river, a corner to the dividing line between Edward Chambers land & mine, West of Berg & Houndsvill, running the East, that a North line to both Jacobs line and along his line the various courses to the land I got of Samuel Sulerberg, so as to make four hundred acres, I have already given to my son John about six hundred acres of land including the healing Springs & house, on flat swamp— I have also given to my son John all the land I have between the bridge, & Alex Longs,

except a piece at this end of the bridge towards the house 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> chains, reserved for the bridge— I also give to my son John in addition of his Negroes I have already given him, my Negroes Ned, Matt, Dave.—

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Locke, Christiana Fisher, and my son John, all that part of my tract of land, on the southwest side of the Gadkin river at the end of the bridge, beginning at a stooping cypresswood on the bank of the river above the bridge, Alex Longs & my corner, running thence, along our line, south twelve ch<sup>s</sup> to a stake, then East ten chains to a stake, then North, to a stake on the bank of the river, then up the river, to the beginning together with all the interest I have in the bridge, that my said daughters Mary & Christiana, and my son John have equal shares of the land and bridge, & profits arising therefrom. I give the said land & bridge to my said daughter John and their heirs forever.—

I give and bequeath to my grandson William Locke two hundred acres of land and seventy acres of land, being the land plot of Andrew Merrett sen. joining the land plot of Fisher & Garden Willis land Moses & Lockes and others, it lies between Moses & Lockes two plantations.—

I give and bequeath to my grandson Charles Fisher, two small tracts of land conveyed to me by Jacob Fisher & wife, and John Hadden and wife, making in the whole one hundred and eighty six acres— I also give to my grandson

Charles Fisher two hundred and forty three acres of land conveyed to me by Jacob Fisher joining the land of Alex Long's place called "Budgets" & the land of Cape Haider, William Moore & the above described lands. Also four lots in the Town of Salisbury, known by Nos. 58, 46 & 46 in the North Square of the Town of Salisbury. I also gave to my said grandson Charles Fisher, eight shares of stock I have in the Cape Fear Bank after the death of my wife, and my Negro boy Jack, that I keep about the house.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Susanna Fisher, the daughter of Charles & Christina Fisher, my Negro woman Katey or Kitt now at the bridge with all the inmates she has or may have.

I give to my son John, six shares of stock I have in the State Bank of North Carolina, after the death of my wife Susanna she draws the dividends as they become due, during her life.

I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint my beloved friends Messrs. A. Locke, Charles Fisher & my son John Beard, Executors of this my last will and testament, revoking all other will or Wills, and I do give to my said Executors all the residue of my estate, both real & personal, not named in this my last Will and Testament, to be disposed of in whatever manner, or way they may think most advisable for the speedy payment of all the debts, which I owe, and do by this presents

authorize and empower my said Executors to sell and make good titles to all such of the Estate they may sell, and should any of my Estate be left after all my debts are paid, the surplus, to be equally divided between my said Executors Messrs. A. Locke, Charles Fisher, and my son John Beard and my wife Susanna. — In Witness whereof I the said Lewis Beard have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and Seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1820
