The last Will and Testament of Marshall Moody

I Marshall Moody of the County of Haywood and State of Tennessee, being weak of body, but of sound mind and memory, do make, declare, ordain and publish this instrument of writing as my last will and testament, the same being intended as a continuation or codicil to the one heretofore made by me, and now of record in the registers books of the County of Haywood, and the only one except this present one in existence, and in the one recorded as aforesaid, I have given as will therein appear, to the three Children by my first wife, to wit: Rebecca Warwell, William W. Moody and John Moody, all the negroes, lands, money and every species of property whatever which I wish or intend for them to have, now or at any time hereafter, and I do now declare the said Rebecca Warwell, William W. Moody and John Moody and their heirs forever debared from any further claim or partition in or of my estate.

And I do now give and bequeath and devise as follows, to wit:

Item I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth the land and plantation where I now reside during her life time, a reasonable quantity of House hold and Kitchen furniture, one year's support of corn, fodder and meat, and the usual and necessary articles for the comfortable support of herself and family, and Horses and Cattle and hogs in sufficient number for her, easy and comfortable support, and one fourth part of the remainder of my estate after all my just debts are paid, for her use and benefit during her life. After the death of my wife the land and all the other property which may be on hand in the possession of my wife at the time of her death, I give to my three youngest Children, to wit: Henry, David and James,

to each share and share alike, Subject however to the following bequests or legacies, to wit: To Rufus W. Spence fifty dollars, Julia Rayland late Julia Spence thirty ^{five} dollars, to Emily Lawson fifty dollars, to Amanda Spence thirty dollars, and to Joseph Spence fifty dollars, which said legacies herein last named are not to be paid until after the death of my wife Elizabeth - and then out of the land, negroes and or other property which may be on hand in her possession at her death.

Item to three sons, to wit: Henry Moody, David Moody and James Moody, I give and bequeath all the balance of my estate, real, mixed and personal, each share and share alike, to them and their heirs forever.

It is my wish and desire that my wife keep the negroes on the plantation, and keep the estate together so far as it may be practicable to do, and at the same time carry out the provisions of this my last will and testament.

The Last will and Testament of Wm Miller dead

William Miller of the County of Waywood and State of Tennessee being of sound mind, but weak of body and being mindful of the uncertainty of life and certainty of death, do make, ordains establish and publish instrument of writing as my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore by me made, if any, in the following words To wit;

First I give and bequeath to my son Simon Miller two negro fellows, namely: Matt and Toney one thousand dollars heretofore handed to him as a loan all the money due me in Virginia or in the hands of any one there for me - and all the money arising from the sale of what lands I yet own in the State of Virginia if said land shall be sold in my life time, if not then my exors. herein after named shall sell it and hand over the money arising from said sale to him, also one thousand dollars to be handed to him by my said executors provided Edmund Tappan pay the amount he now owes me, or so much as the one thousand dollars, this last thousand dollars I give to my son Simon in the place of land -

Secondly I loan to my daughter Susannah Miller the following property - one negro man Stephen ^{his} ~~his~~ wife Mary, one named Jerry, one negro named Beck, one named Edmund for and during her natural life said negroes to be subject to the control and management of my said Executors, but for the use and benefit of the said Susannah as long as she may live - and at her death said property and the increase of the females if any including any fund or thing that may arise from the labor or hire of said negroes over & above a comfortable support and maintenance of

my said daughter Susannah, to go to and be divided equally share & share alike among my other Children, or their legal representatives & heirs absolutely including my grand daughter Sally Jones & my great grand daughter Sarah Jones they two taking in said division one share to be divided between them - I also give and bequeath absolutely unto my said daughter Susannah one horse & wide saddle, one feather bed and furniture and bedstead.

Thirdly I loan to my great grand daughter Sarah Jones (Child of my grand son William & b Jones the following property, to wit: one negro girl named Pineva, one negro boy named Lise and the one half of my tract of land lying in ^{this} (Waywood) County known and commonly called The ~~off~~ ^{Mc} ~~Grady~~ ^{Grady} tract containing something like five hundred acres. all of said property to be and remain in the hands and under the control of my said Executors for the use, support, maintenance &c of the said Sarah Jones, untill she may marry or ~~become of age~~ ^{become} ~~be~~ or arrive at ~~the~~ ^{become} twenty one years of age, when my said executors shall deliver said property to her, and at her death, should she die leaving lawful issue living then said property to go and belong to such issue absolutely forever, but should she die leaving no such issue then and in that ~~event~~ ^{case} all ~~of~~ ^{of} said property to go and belong to my ~~great~~ ^{next} grand daughter Sally ~~Mc~~ ^{Mc} Jones absolutely if living, if dead, to her lawful issue if any, and if none, then to be equally divided among my Children or their heirs and lawful representatives including my daughter Susannah.

Fourthly I loan to my grand daughter Sally Mc Jones the following property, namely one negro man named Nary and his wife Patience and their two Children, and the one half of my tract of land

lying in this County called and commonly known as the V. Ginkler tract containing something like five hundred acres, all of said property to be and remain in the hands and subject to the control of my said executors for the use, support, maintenance of my said grand child, untill she may marry or arrive and become twenty one years of age, when my said executors shall deliver said property to her, and at her death should she die leaving lawful issue living then said property to go and belong to such issue absolutely forever, but should she die leaving no such issue then and in that event said property to go and belong to my great grand daughter Sarah Jones, if living, if dead to her lawful issue if any, and for want thereof then to be equally divided among my children or their heirs and legal representatives, excluding my my said daughter Susannah. I also give and bequeath unto my said grand daughter Sally of Jones, one horse and hide saddle, one feather bed and furniture and bedstead, absolutely forever.

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Miller for and during her natural life the following ^{property} to wit, all of my negro slaves not otherwise disposed of and devised away by this will, all of my cleared land lying on the South side of the lane passing through my farm including the improvements and houses wherein I now live, with liberty to take and use rail timber and other timber to keep up her farm and plantation from any other of my lands, and also to clear and cultivate if she should want it, as much of my wood land adjoining the tract laid off to her as she may desire.

all of my household and kitchen furniture, all of my plantation and farming utensils, hords, hogs, cows, sheep and every other kind and species of property whatever that I may die seized of, not specifically disposed of to some other person, and at her death said land, provided my said daughter Susannah be not living shall go and belong to my son William Miller absolutely in fee simple forever and to his heirs. But if my said daughter Susannah be alive at the death of my wife Elizabeth, she is still to remain in the possession of the said land here devised and set apart to my wife, for and during her natural life, as herein more fully stated, and the balance of said property herein devised to my wife for life, at her death to go absolutely to my children and their heirs forever including my grand daughter and great grand daughter above mentioned they two taking one share, and excluding my daughter Susannah who is amply provided for during her life.

And it is my wish and desire and I do bequeath that if my wife the said Elizabeth should at any time be of opinion that she could at any time spare any part or portion of the here left her, without injury to herself and that the same would be of advantage to my children, then it is my wish that my said executors shall select three competent men to value such property & divide and allot the same among all my children (except the said Susannah) share and share alike and to their heirs and ^{legal} representatives including my said great grand child, and grand child, they two taking one share between them.

Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my son William Miller the following property, to wit, one negro fellow named Hase and one negro fellow named Phil absolutely

and I leave to my said son William Miller all my land not otherwise herein specifically disposed of for and during his natural life, and at his death said land to go to and belong his heirs lawfully begotten share and share alike in fee simple forever.

Seventhly It is my wish and desire and I do bequeath that my said daughter Susannah Miller shall live and have a home with my said wife Elizabeth in and upon the plantation houses &c herein devised to my said wife for and during the life of her the said Susannah.

Eighthly I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said two sons Simon Miller and William Miller my executors to this my last will and testament, and as I have full confidence in their integrity and honesty, it is my express declaration that they shall not be required to give bond and security before obtaining letters testamentary upon my estate.

In witness whereof I have said William Miller have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the eighth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty in presence of the two subscribing witnesses thereto.

Estor & Miller Jones named as Commissioners in said Order appointed to divide the slaves of Robert C. Scott deceased according to the last will and testament of said R. C. Scott have had brought before us by the executor the following twenty seven slaves to wit: Madison, Maria, Reuben, Ruffin, Amy, Sally, Dick, Rachel, Old Peggy, Charles Ann Glenn, Mary, Stoked, Young Sam, Ann Edmondson, Child Letitia, Sam, Sally, Child Garland, Philly, Caroline, Old Tom, Ann Eliza, Rose, Old Molly.

Which said slaves we have apportioned and distributed to the nine legatees hereafter named in manner and form following, that is to say:

The negro slaves above mentioned were examined respectively and each one valued by us, they were then designated in nine lots which said lots were numbered and placed together in a hat, the nine legatees names were then placed in another hat and as the name was drawn from one hat the lots were respectively drawn and the same set down to such legatee as they fell to in such designations. We therefore beg leave to report as the result of our proceedings that Lot No. 1 consisting of Madison valued at \$900, Maria at \$500- & Reuben at \$100. making in the aggregate \$1500 was drawn for Virginia Lafayette Scott.

Lot No. 2. Consisting of Ruffin valued at \$900, Amy & \$275, & Sally & \$200. making in the aggregate \$1375, was drawn for Thomas & P. Rayner.

Lot No. 3. Consisting of Dick valued at \$850-

3. *Shilly* \$250 & *Rachel* 250. & old *Eggy* \$1⁰⁰ making in the aggregate \$1357 was drawn by *Harriet* 1/6 *Scott*.

4 Lot No 4. Consisting of *Charles* valued at \$800. & *Ann Glenn* at \$600. making in the aggregate \$1400 was drawn for *John A. Scott*.

5 Lot No 5 Consisting of *Jim* valued at \$875. & *Mary* \$300. & *Stokes* \$200 - \$1375. was drawn for *Thomas* 1/6 *Scott*.

6 Lot No 6 Consisting of *Ann Edmonston* and Child *Lethy* valued at \$800. & young *Sam* at \$600. making \$1400 was drawn for *James Boyd*.

7 Lot No 7. Consisting of *C. Sam* valued at \$700. *Sally* and Child *Barland* \$700 making \$1400. was drawn for *Robert C. Scott*.
