Nov 23rd 1841.

In the name of God. Amen,

~~being in bed~~ I John D Campbell being in bad health so make this my last will and testament- In the first place it is my will that my two tracts of land be sold by my executor either privately or publicly as he may think best, also my horses, Cattle & stock hogs, and my part of the pork that will be on hand. sold also except two Milch Cows & Calves which I intend that sister Jane shall have - and after paying my just debts, it is my will that the balance of the proceeds of the above named property be equally divided between my brothers William J. Campbell & Andrew M. Campbell & sisters Mary Campbell, Jane Campbell, Deborah Smith, Margaret Walker & Harriet Burford. If sister Mary should not live to get her part in possession it is my will that it be equally divided between the above named brothers and sisters.

In the second place I do will and bequeath to brother Robert Campbell my negro boy Amzi to him & his heirs forever by him paying to my executor the sum of three hundred dollars, which sum I wish to be equally divided between my brothers & sisters above named, and sister Mary's part should she not live to get it in possession is to be divided as as her other portion directed above -

In the 3rd place I do will that Brother Andrew have my silver watch -

In the 4th place I do will to brother William my double barrel gun, also my farmin

utensils of every description, I also will that my part of the Corn, Oats, fodder, wheat &c remain unsold for the use of brother William & my sisters that live with him -

In the 5th place I do will that my brother Robert have my feather bed and furniture that is attached to it.

In the 6th place I will that sister Jane have all my house hold and Kitchen furniture -
