Will of James Wilson

In the name of God, Amen.
It being appointed by God that all men once should die & dispose of his worldly effects according to his own election, I James Wilson of Haywood County and State of Tennessee, being of sound mind and memory do this day ordain this my last will and testament as follows.

First I will my soul to God who gave it, & my body at the discretion of my executor; to be buried in a Christian like manner, and after paying all just debts, I will & bequeath to my wife Eliza all the land on which I now live, containing two hundred acres, to have and to hold as her own during her natural life with full power to sell and dispose of as her own together with all the goods, Chattels and appurtenances thereto and on the premises, Consisting of hogs, horses, Cows, household and Kitchen furniture of every description that I own at this time; after the death of Eliza, my wife it is my will that the land and all of which she may be seized, should go to my two Children, David & Miles equally to be divided between them, And for affection due to them, I give and bequeath to my sons David and Miles, ten dollars each to be paid after my death by the Executor whom I shall appoint.

And in the last place I do appoint my Wife Eliza the executor of this my last will & testament, which is intended to revoke all others, Signed in presence

Robt. Burns' Will

I Robert Burns of the County of Haywood and State of Tennessee, being sound in mind but weak in body, do make and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby ~~revoking~~ ^{at any time} and making void all other wills by me made.

First, I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any monies I may die possessed of, or that may first come into the hands of my executor.

Second, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her natural life, (provided she remains single and if not during Widowhood,) all my household and Kitchen furniture, all my stock of horses, Cattle, hogs and Sheep, my two tracts of land, except such as may be herein afterwards mentioned.

Third, I give and bequeath to my son Stephen R. Burns fifty acres land, taken from the East end of the tract on which I now live, in which he now resides.

Fourth, My will and desire is that my Daughter Isabella Kelly be furnished by my wife out of my Estate as soon as she can without disfurnishing herself one horse, saddle and and bridle of the value of about seventy or seventy five dollars.

Fifth, My desire is that my daughter Rebecca Mahon be furnished by my wife out of my estate, one Cow and Calf of the value of ten or twelve dollars, so soon as she can do so without inconvenience.

Sixth, My desire is that my beloved wife whenever she may proper and can obtain a fair price to sell either of tracts of land at her option, and the proceeds thereof to be expended in purchasing a negro or negroes to assist her in raising and educating

My Children

Seventh, My mother in law Enelope Booth and myself some years since, made the following contract which I wish complied with, I was to furnish support for her and her old negro Woman Aggy during her natural life in consideration of which she gave me at the time her stock of hogs and was to furnish yearly out of her part of rent of the plantation fifteen or twenty barrels of Corn, and if at any time she wished to leave my house as her home, I was to give her in return for her stock of hogs eighteen dollars, but if she continued my house as her home till her death the property was all to be mine, my desire is that she continue her home with my wife the same as she would have provided I was living.

Eighth, My desire is that if my Younger Children should arrive to the years of maturity during the life time or widowhood of my wife that she give them assistance out of my estate in advancing them in proportion as far as my elder Children has been, if she can do so without inconvenience, but to be sure not to do so to the injury of herself and Younger Children.

Ninth, My wish and desire is that at the death of my wife, or the end of her widowhood, that all the property of every kind whatsoever, whether it consists in land or negroes be sold on a twelve months Credit, and ^{the proceeds} to be equally divided amongst my wife (provided she be living) and eight Children after the Youngest equal in valuation to those I have already advanced in my life time, to make it more plain and easy to be understood, I wish my wife and the following Children, to wit,

May 1840

Isabella Kelly, Rebecca Mahon, John P. Robert & James H. and Sarah P. be made equal with Stephen B. Burns whom I have already advanced and the balance if any, then to be equally divided share and share alike amongst all my Children. Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Charlotte Burns my executrix to this my last will and testament.

Humphreys, Saml. Humphreys, Avarilla and Harriet Humphreys one eleventh part of the above named property &c.

May Term 1840

Item 6th It is my will and desire that if any of the afore named grand Children should die before they become of age or marry that their proportionable part of the estate go to their Brothers and Sisters of said deceased.

Lastly. I do hereby nominate and appoint my sons Samuel Lusk & Crowder Holloway my Executors having full Confidence in the integrity of my executors, that it is my desire that they do not be required to give any obligation for their faithful discharge of duty in transacting the business of my estate.
